Presently, 90 CCCs have courses that have been granted C-ID numbers; range of courses approved is **1-91**;

Draft Discipline Status Report

Anthropology – 1 descriptor Intro to Language and Culture) re-posted for vetting until October 15

Biology – Anatomy and Physiology should be posted as final very soon; a draft Anatomy and Physiology **sequence** will soon be posted for vetting until October 15: FDRG will be meeting soon to prepare 2 additional descriptors (for the TMC) & TMC for vetting (early Fall)

Communication – 1 draft descriptor (Persuasion) posted for vetting until October 15

Kinesiology – Kinesiology has recently drafted 5 descriptors for their activity courses and grouped them according to the activity areas (e.g. "aquatics"). They will be posted until October 15.

Mathematics – 8 draft descriptors to be re-posted for vetting very soon until October 15.

Radio/TV/Film – draft descriptors and TMC to be posted this fall for vetting

As always, please remind your faculty to participate in the vetting process!

Fall DIG dates scheduled

C-ID will host several DIG meetings in the Fall; the dates will be Friday, October 19 (South) and Friday, November 2 (North). Disciplines and locations to be announced soon.

The **Engineering FDRG** will be meeting in September to continue their work on developing descriptors and discussing a possible TMC. We also continue to work with a **Nursing FDRG**.

CSU AOs are now able to submit their C-ID identified comparable courses directly into the C-ID website.

Keep an eye on the COURSES page under the CSU list of disciplines and courses – the number of courses identified by CSU campuses as comparable to C-ID descriptors is growing steadily.

TCSU Approved Courses Expiring & Notices Being Sent

CCC AOs are starting to receive notifications from C-ID that TCSU courses already in the system with a date up to and including 2007 will be expiring on **February 28, 2013**. TCSU courses from 2008 will be expiring on **September 30, 2013**.

TCSU courses from 2009 will expire on **September 30, 2014**.

Courses that were granted TCSU numbers prior to 2008 will not automatically be granted a C-ID designation.

All other courses will come up for review five years from the date on the Course Outline of Record (this is the date your campus approved the outline) as entered upon submission of the course to C-ID.

The C-ID system will allow AOs to submit a Course Outline of Record against a C-ID descriptor in which an institution already has a TCSU approved course. Holly has recently sent individual campus notices with instructions of how to submit your CORs.
