## DESCRIPTOR BASED ARTICULATION UPDATE

- Proposals for descriptor-based articulation were sent to CSU campuses and Independent Colleges and Universities in January.
- At present, the following CSU campus faculty have articulated with C-ID descriptors for Communication Studies, Geology, and/or Sociology: Channel Islands, Chico, Long Beach, and San Bernardino
- Independent Colleges/Universities which have articulated with these descriptors include: National University, Whittier College, and William Jessup University
- **COMING SOON TO c-id.net**: A catalog of courses articulated with C-ID descriptors.

# TMC Update:

- The first finalized Transfer Model Curricula (TMC) are now available in: Communication Studies, Psychology, and Sociology. Faculty from the CCCs and CSUs drafted and vetted these first TMC in response to SB 1440.
  - Following closely behind these majors are others in various stages of development. Group 2 TMC are Administration of Justice/Criminal Justice, Kinesiology/Physical Education, and Mathematics.

### DIG(Discipline Input Group) REGISTRATION NUMBERS STRONG

- At present, CID has **150 faculty** registered in the North; **167 faculty** registered in the South
- Registered Articulation Officers in the North = 14 (9 CCC/5 CSU); in the South = 22 (22 CCC)
