Seeking Articulation of AG & Comm Studies descriptors October 2010 – Articulation Officer Update

Course Descriptors Now Finalized: Agriculture and Communications

As you know, the C-ID process begins with the convening of a Faculty Discipline Review Group (FDRG) consisting of inter-segmental discipline faculty and an Articulation Officer. The FDRG develops descriptors (comparable to a CCC course outline of record) that are added to the C-ID website's online database (www.c-id.net) for statewide disciplinary review.

We are very pleased that the process of articulating the finalized descriptors of **Agriculture** and **Communication Studies** may begin.

Community College Process

- Go to www.c-id.net
- Review the finalized descriptors (AG and Communication Studies)
- Determine which comparable courses your campus offers
- If your faculty are willing to accept a C-ID course in lieu of your native course (intrasegmental articulation) then a C-ID designation should be sought.
- Course outlines may then be submitted for review under the "Course Review" tab (each CCC AO should have received a log-in and password)
- Courses will be reviewed by at least 2 faculty reviewers from different segments
- Notification of course approval or recommendations (if any) for additional information will be sent to the Articulation Officer
- CCC courses that have already been granted a TCSU number will be given the associated C-ID designation
- Where "C-ID based" articulation with 4 year campuses has been established, the community college will gain that articulation
- The respective C-ID number(s) will be posted on the C-ID website in a format similar to the CAN matrix and will eventually be displayed on ASSIST as part of the Next Generation Project.

Four-year College Process

- Go to www.c-id.net
- Review the finalized descriptors (AG and Communication Studies)
- Determine comparable courses at your campus
- If a determination is made by discipline faculty to articulate or fast-track courses with C-ID designations, communicate this commitment to Katey@asccc.org or await the forthcoming request for articulation by the C-ID office
- If a determination is made not to articulate due to concerns about the descriptors, please communicate this to C-ID (katey@asccc.org)
- When the determination is made by the discipline faculty to accept C-ID descriptors for your comparable courses, the C-ID office will request this course data and it will be displayed on the C-ID website.
