Dear Articulation Officers,

California State University, Long Beach provides all public institutions of higher education with information concerning forthcoming, relevant changes to our lower-division curriculum. The changes to courses noted in the attachments will be effective with the Spring 2012 semester. Program changes, however, will not be effective until Fall 2012. Articulation agreements will not need any review unless specifically stated. The attachments are divided by colleges, i.e., COTA College of the Arts, COE College of Engineering, CHHS College of Health and Human Services, CLA College of Liberal Arts, and CNSM College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics.

To reiterate our fundamental articulation policy: CSU, Long Beach wishes to articulate as many lower division courses with California institutions as possible. In general, we do not articulate between upper-division and lower-division courses. We require a standard course outline for review in all requests for articulation.

 evolution through various stages leading to its current expression, analyzing the social
 influences and contributions of prominent designers of various periods.
- o KIN 198L Group Exercise: Stretch and Relaxation (1) This course emphasizes the development of range of motion in the joints focusing on muscle flexibility. Included is the practice of relaxation techniques and flexibility exercises to improve general wellness.
