CURRICULUM CHANGES CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY SACRAMENTO 12-14 CATALOG

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE:

Course department prefix change from EDS to DEAF

ANTHROPOLOGY:

No Changes.

ART:

New course ART 1C Modern & Contemporary Art: Rococo to the Present

Art is replacing their two course introductory art history sequence ART 1A and ART 1B with a three course sequence. The coverage of ART 1A is unchanged, but ART 1B now will cover Renaissance to Baroque, and the new 1C course will cover Rococo to the Present. ART 1C will be offered for the first time in spring 2014.

ASIAN STUDIES:

New major effective 11-12 (formerly a concentration under Ethnic Studies).

BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES:

Lower division courses are listed by concentration at the top of the agreement. Students should take lower division preparation for their concentration only. Note: Course to course articulation is listed for <u>all</u> concentrations on the bottom section of the agreement.

All Biological Science majors will be required to take <u>BIOL 139 General Microbiology</u> at the upper Division level. Biological Science will no longer articulate a lower division course for this requirement.

Transfer Students will be admitted as pre-majors. Completion of the following is required prior to declaring the Biological Sciences major at Sacramento State.

- 1. <u>BIO 1, BIO 2, CHEM 1A, STAT 1,</u> and <u>ENGL 1A</u> (or equivalent) with least a "C-" or better. Only first or second attempt will be considered.
- 2. Overall GPA of 2.3 based on the most recent 30 graded semester units and on any of the courses listed above that were taken prior to the last 30 graded semester units.
- 3. Minimum of 30 units completed at the college level.

To declare Biological Sciences as their major students will submit a Declaration of Major form to the Biological Science Department Office along with transcript copies

If you have students who plan to matriculate to CSU Sacramento as Biological Sciences majors, it is <u>imperative</u> that they complete their lower division biology and chemistry course work PRIOR TO TRANSFER. We are severely limiting seats in BIO 1 (the equivalent of your sequence in zoology and botany), and transfer students will not have access to that class once they arrive on the CSUS campus. As this course is a prerequisite to entering the major, these students will be stuck if they do not complete these courses on your campus.

BUSINESS:

MGMT 10 Introduction to Business Law has been added to the lower division major preparation. Business is allowing former articulation with our former Business Law course (OBE 18) to stand resubmission of course outline is not necessary.

OBE 19 now FIN 19 prefix change only

Effective Fall 2013 students graduating with a B.S. Degree in Business will not be held to Sacramento State's Foreign Language Requirement.

Effective Fall 2013 students graduating with a B.S. Degree in Chemistry will not be held to Sacramento State's Foreign Language Requirement.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT

COMMUNICATION STUDIES:

<u>Media Communication</u> concentration has been changed to <u>Mass Communication</u> no changes to lower division preparation.

Prior to acceptance as a Communication Studies major, students must complete a pre-major consisting of all required lower division courses plus the upper division survey course (<u>COMS 100A</u>). Students must successfully complete each pre-major course with a grade of "C-" or better. Students with a Sacramento State grade point average of 2.3 or better may request early admission to the major.

COMPUTER ENGINEERING:

Effective Fall 2013 students graduating with a B.S. Degree in Computer Engineering will not be held to Sacramento State's Foreign Language Requirement.

COMPUTER SCIENCE:

Effective Fall 2013 students graduating with a B.S. Degree in Computer Science will not be held to Sacramento State's Foreign Language Requirement.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT:

CE 9 Plane and Topographic Survey was removed and replaced by CM 9 Construction Surveying and Layout. The new CM 9 course was developed to focus on surveying topics and practices that are more applicable to CM students. ENLG 20T Expository Writing — Technical Communications has been deleted from the curriculum. (This course was listed on the agreement as an option for completing our ENGL 20).

Effective Fall 2013 students graduating with a B.S. Degree in Construction Management will not be held to Sacramento State's Foreign Language Requirement.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE:

EARTH SCIENCE:

No changes.

ECONOMICS:

Minimum "C" grade required in all lower division coursework for the major <u>ECON 1A</u>, <u>ECON 1B</u> and STAT 1

ENGINEERING:

Civil - No changes.

<u>Electrical</u> – <u>ENGR 1 Introduction to Engineering</u> has been added to lower division preparation. This course is compatible with the Introduction to Engineering course that is part of the Transfer Model Curriculum in response to SB 1440. <u>ENGR 50 Computational Methods and Applications</u> this is a new course designed to be compatible with the new Transfer Model Curriculum (TMC) and the AS-T Engineering degree in response to SB 1440. This course will eventually replace <u>CSC 25</u>.

Mechanical – No changes.

Reminder: All courses required in the Engineering majors including electives in the major, ENLG 1A and ENGL 20 must be completed with a min C- grade.

Effective Fall 2013 students graduating with a B.S. Degree in Engineering - Civil, Electrical/Electronic or Mechanical will not be held to Sacramento State's Foreign Language Requirement.

ENGLISH:

No changes.

ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES:

No changes.

FAMILY & CONSUMER SCIENCE:

New lower division courses <u>FACS 9 Food Safety and Sanitation</u> and <u>FACS 30 Fashion and Human</u> Environment.

<u>FACS 9</u> (formerly FACS 109 an upper division core course) now a lower division requirement will meet the need as a prerequisite requirement earlier in the Nutrition and Food Concentration program.

The new introductory course <u>FACS 30</u> will replace the "ART 20A or ART 97, or INTD 20" option currently on the 12-13 agreement for the Fashion Merchandising and Design Concentration (formerly Apparel Marketing and Design).

FILM STUDIES:

No changes.

FOREIGN LANGUAGES:

Foreign Languages are not required lower-division preparation for any "Major," and are no longer formally articulated.

<u>Spanish 47- Introduction to Composition and Grammar Review</u> this course is not new and not required for the major however will be listed on the agreement as a lower division elective option for the Spanish major.

New courses offered Korean 1A, 1B, 2A and 2B

HUMANITIES & RELIGIOUS STUDIES:

Religious Studies concentration students need to only select three of the four lower division courses listed in section A. on the agreement.

JOURNALISM:

Prior to acceptance as a Journalism Major, students must first complete a pre-major consisting of all required lower division courses plus JOUR 130A and JOUR 130B. Students must successfully complete each pre-major course with a grade of "C-" or better. Students with a Sacramento State grade point average of 2.3 or better may request early admission to the major.

KINESIOLOGY:

Minimum "C" grade required for all courses in Exercise Science Concentration.

BIOL 26 Anatomy and Physiology II has been removed from lower division major prep for the P.E. concentration. BIOL 131 Systemic Physiology has been removed from the Athletic Training and Exercise Science Concentrations. Biological Science will no longer articulate a lower division course for this requirement. All Kinesiology majors with a concentration in Athletic Training or Exercise Science will be required to take BIOL 131 Systemic Physiology at the upper division level.

Effective Fall 2013 students graduating with a B.S. Degree in Kinesiology will not be held to Sacramento State's Foreign Language Requirement.

LIBERAL STUDIES:

MATHEMATICS:

MUSIC:

BA Concentration in Music – <u>MUSC 1, 2, 3 and 14D</u> are replaced by <u>MUSC 14C</u> reducing the number of units required for this degree to better align with the Music TMC in response to SB 1440.

NURSING:

NURS 14 will no longer be required as a co requisite for the nursing program.

Effective Fall 2013 students graduating with a B.S. Degree in Nursing will not be held to Sacramento State's Foreign Language Requirement.
