AFAM 280 - Introduction to African American History (3)

Introduction to key events, individuals, institutions and experiences that shaped the history and culture of Africans and their descendants from their arrival in North America in 1619 to the present.

GEOG 180 – Digital Earth: Introduction to Geospatial Technologies (3)

Prerequisite: 3 units minimum from G.E. Categories B.1-B.4. Introduction to geospatial technologies, including, Geographic Information Systems (GIS), Global Positioning Systems (GPS), remote sensing. Web mapping and location-based services.
