

How to Respond to a Request for a Syllabus An Important Message from your Articulation Officer

Hello Mesa Community,

Welcome Back!

Former students, colleges and universities may request a course syllabus. The reason for the request is usually due to the need for an evaluation of the course for equivalency in meeting an academic requirement.

The official document provided by California Community Colleges for the evaluation of course content is the course outline of record (COR). CORs are used by Articulation Officers to establish and maintain articulation agreements.

There have been challenges establishing and maintaining articulation agreements. Several colleges and universities have denied articulation proposals due to the evaluation of the syllabus, instead of the COR. The information contained in syllabi vary among professors and often lacks the necessary content for course equivalency/articulation evaluation.

I respectfully request that you **not** provide a syllabus to anyone other than students enrolled in your current course (s). If a request for a syllabus is received, please direct the individual to CurricUNET <u>http://www.curricunet.com/SDCCD/</u> to obtain a COR. Active CORs are available to the public without the need for a CurricUNET user name or password. Requests may also be re-directed to Sue Saetia (ssaetia@sdccd.edu) or me.
