Hello all,

More late breaking news. In the past couple of weeks, the geography department has eliminated its four lower division courses, of which only one, Geography 10, is a requirement for the major. This does have broader impact beyond Geographic Studies. Four other majors also use the four lower division courses as one of many courses to meet specific lower division requirements. The majors are: African-American Studies, Landscape Architecture, Nutrition Science, and Sociology. In every major, there are other courses available to meet the given requirement and thus should have minimal impact on your students' proper preparation for transfer.

We will be removing from ASSIST the following courses: Geo 1 - Physical Geography, GEO 2 Introduction to Cultural Geography, GEO 2G Introduction to Cultural Geography: Discussion, and GEO 10 The World's Regions. Students who completed the course(s) by spring 2006 will receive subject credit. Your community college courses are still transferable courses and students who take these courses in future terms will continue to receive elective credit.

California State University Lower Division Transfer Pattern (LDTP)

Please note the following statement regarding the LDTP as provided by the California State University Office of the Chancellor. Participation in the LDTP project will require faculty involvement. The Lower-Division Transfer Pattern (LDTP) project, sponsored by the California State University (CSU) and supported by the California Community Colleges, presents potential transfer students with the most direct path to a bachelor's degree in the CSU system. The LDTP project provides a set of "road maps" for students to follow that will ensure appropriate academic preparation and that will decrease time to graduation once LDTP students enter the CSU. Students may enter into an LDTP agreement up to the time they have completed 45 transferable units. Students who elect to follow the LDTP option will receive the highest priority for admission to a CSU campus.

"Highest priority for admission" is defined as a written guarantee of admission to a particular CSU campus and major, and it goes into effect when both the student and the CSU campus ratify an LDTP agreement. The guarantee is subject both to satisfactory completion of the agreement requirements and to the campus's ability to accommodate the student. Students will be asked to complete successfully a specified set of general education courses and major courses that will be common to all CSU campuses offering that major, and they will be asked to complete successfully an additional set of courses identified by the particular CSU campus named in the LDTP agreement. The coursework in the systemwide and campus-specific LDTP pattern will total at least 60 units, the number needed to transfer to CSU as an upper-division student.

Through CSUMentor and ASSIST, students and counselors will be able to find road maps detailing coursework preparation by CSU campus and major.
