# SFSU PREREQUISITE CHANGES IN CHEMISTRY COURSES ~ EFFECTIVE FALL 2006


Many courses offered by the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry will have *new prerequisites* effective Fall 2006. Most significant is the change in the minimum grade in prerequisite chemistry courses: a C or better grade will be required, instead of the current C- or better grade. Additional prerequisite changes apply to CHEM 340 and 349.

COURSE	NEW PREREQUISITE(S)	
CHEM 215	C or better in CHEM 115 and C- or better in 2 of the following courses: PHYS 111, PHYS 121; PHYS 220, PHYS 230, or PHYS 240; MATH 226, MATH 227; or consent of instructor.	
CHEM 216	C or better in CHEM 215 or concurrent enrollment.	
CHEM 300	CHEM 215, CHEM 320, CHEM 333, MATH 227 and PHYS 121 or PHYS 240 each with a grade of C or better. CHEM 340 or 349 recommended.	
CHEM 320	CHEM 215 and 216, each with a grade of C or better.	
CHEM 333	CHEM 115 with a grade of C or better.	
CHEM 334	CHEM 333 or 130 with a grade of C or better, or concurrent enrollment in either.	
CHEM 340	CHEM 215 and 335, each with a grade of C or better.	
CHEM 349	CHEM 115 and CHEM 130 or 335 with a grade of C or better, or consent of instructor.	
CHEM 351	CHEM 215, CHEM 333, and CHEM 251 (or MATH 228 and PHYS 240) each with a grade of C or better.	
CHEM 353	CHEM 320, CHEM 333, and CHEM 251 (or MATH 228 and PHYS 240) each with a grade of C or better.	
CHEM 451	CHEM 351 or CHEM 301, CHEM 251 (or equivalent), and CHEM 422 (may be taken concurrently), each with a grade of C or better, or consent of instructor.
