On behalf of the ASSIST Executive Management Oversight Committee (EMOC), we are pleased to share the conclusion of the Request for Proposal (RFP) process to select a vendor for the ASSIST Next Generation project. The University of California, as the fiscal agent for ASSIST, has signed an agreement with Governet to develop and implement an updated, statewide course articulation database.

ASSIST is the official repository of public college and university course articulation in the State of California. Stakeholders from the California Community Colleges, California State University and University of California endorsed the development of the ASSIST Next Generation project to modernize technology supporting ASSIST, streamline the articulation process for participating institutions, address outstanding opportunities, and create a more robust, extensible database which preserves existing functionality and lays the foundation for enhancements.

ASSIST is used by thousands of students, family members and educators each day and its value in promoting higher education and transfer in California is immeasurable. We are extremely appreciative of the commitment of ASSIST stakeholders, staff at the ASSIST Coordination Site (ACS), and members of the RFP selection committee in the development of the Next Generation project. During the development phase, ACS staff will engage representatives from all three segments of public higher education in California. Progress updates will be shared via the ASSIST Information Center and through articulation and evaluation bodies across the three segments.

We are pleased to achieve this significant milestone in the development of ASSIST Next Generation and look forward to the future benefits this endeavor will bring to students, educators, and the State of California.
