Fall Highlights:

- Student Success Teams: The Student Success Teams project group concluded their fall workshops. Over 100 community members participated, which included faculty, classified professionals, and students. One major outcome of the workshops was that of the four frameworks, there is a clear preference for the Academic and Career Pathways. Many are excited to be involved, but there are concerns regarding time commitments and workload. There is a hope that this will lead to collaboration and breaking down silos, while making it easier for students to find out about existing resources.
- As part of the Mesa Pathways Project Funding, we have awarded over \$39,000 to fund 8 projects.
- Creation of 3 new project teams:
 - Technology Project Team: In the process of developing a plan and timeline for integrating all of Mesa College's student support services and technologies into a seamless, efficient, and effective resource to enhance the overall student experience.
 - Data Coaching Project Team: In partnership with Institutional Effectiveness, data coaches will be a diverse team of campus professionals who will be serving in a support role to assist in having data inform and shape our transformational work in and through the vision of our Mesa 2030 plan.
 - Student Success Teams (SST) Project Team: This project team will offer next steps regarding structure, goals, and objectives of Mesa's Student Success Teams. This is important work in advancing our Pathways efforts and ensuring Mesa continues to provide strong support to our students.
- Pathways Communications Workgroup finalized the creation of the <u>Mesa Pathways</u>
 <u>Glossary</u>. This long-term project included the identification of terms, definitions, as well
 as the addition of URLs or source info and a list of acronyms.
