THE WHY

Because at Mesa we recognize that the educational journey for some students can be lengthy, confusing, costly, and/or inequitable.

THE WHAT

As an institution, provide guided exploration, clear paths, increased support, and effective classroom practices to help students work efficiently towards their goals.

THE HOW

Work collaboratively within the college governance structure, utilizing the expertise of all campus and community constituents.

The Goal

To create, implement, and scale practices that enable us as an institution to:

- Clarify the Path—assist students in identifying goals
- Enter the Path—help students embark on the steps toward their goals.
- Stay on the Path—provide ongoing supports to students to continue towards their goals, and/or changing course in informed ways.
- Ensure Learning—implement meaningful approaches and equitable practices to promote learning.

The Mesa Pathways survey revealed the following concerns regarding Pathways work:

- GP has destroyed programs (humanities for example)
- GP has resulted in the elimination of important courses
- GP limits options for students
- Mesa-majors eliminate individual major options by lumping many together under one large umbrella major
- GP is inequitable in that it focuses solely on full-time students

Mesa is committed to using Guided Pathways to improve the student experience. Mesa Pathways is committed to using existing structures for program planning and to our fundamental values around preserving comprehensive program offerings, student choice, and equitable practices.

Discipline and Counseling Faculty have considered the following points in developing and reviewing the map:

- Maps do not require scheduling courses semester by semester, but can instead provide a general outline of how students would progress through the program
 - If maps are scheduled semester by semester, students will have a variety of progression maps from which to choose, based on their individual needs
 - If maps are scheduled semester by semester, students will have the option of selecting a part-time, full-time or accelerated progression map as appropriate for the discipline (each of these maps may be completed separately under a separate Reviewer Recommendation Form)
- Students will be able to select their own general education courses and electives
- Counseling, Transfer, Career, & Other Student Services will be incorporated at appropriate junctures on the map
- Students in specialized programs/populations (e.g. CoWONAs, DSPS, EOPS, FAST Scholars, International Students, NEXT-UP, Promise Students, PUENTE, UMOJA, STEM, Veterans, etc.) will be accommodated as necessary to meet their program requirements
- Program Requirements
- Course Prerequisites/Co-requisites
- Any significant elective course recommendations that serve the needs of the programs and will be beneficial to students
- Maps may sequentially list all student choices semester to semester, but this is not required
- Leaving space for individual student exploration based on personal interests
- Course Availability for each Semester or Term in Question

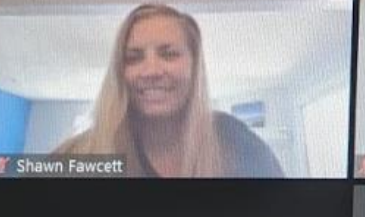

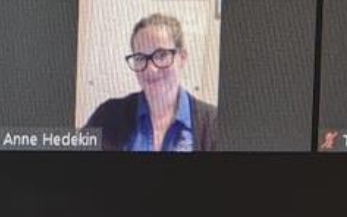
