- **Pathways Project Funding**
 - Application process closed March 15, 2021.
 - 12 proposals received, 6 proposals were approved by MPC.
 - Award recipients and non-award recipients will be notified via email the week of April 5th, 2021.
- **Mesa Pathways Mixers: Update**
 - Mixers provide an opportunity to sort Mesa's 191 degrees and certificates programs into Meta-Majors* (**name change TBD*)
 - Led by the Guided Majors and Mapping workgroup leads, Ian Duckles and Cynthia Rico, a total of 10 mixers took place in February and March, including the following:
 - 6 instructional faculty mixers
 - 3 classified professionals mixers
 - 1 mixer for Deans Council

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- demographic changes.
 - Data from our community.
 - A Labor market analysis
 - An internal analysis.
 - The facilities recommendations are based on a facilities and space analysis
- The consultants reviewed:
 - Past Program Review documents.
 - The Mesa College website
 - The Equity Plan
 - And many more sources included to develop the plan.
 - Consultants focused on Mesa's identity
- Over the course of the two years that we've been involved with the consultants, we've had at least **10 major events** that have involved over **500 different pieces of feedback or input** from various folks.
 - Convocation
 - A poster sharing session
 - Two sets of Department and Program interviews
 - Student focus groups
 - A campus survey that included both students and employees
 - A community survey to learn about surrounding neighborhoods of Mesa College.
 - Partnered with an environmental sustainability committee to look at how we can make our plan sustainable in terms of all the different resources that we anticipate using over the next 10 years.
- College planning context:
 - Focus our educational vision as the leading college of equity and excellence
 - Focus on existing programs on our campus:
 - Strong Workforce
 - HSI grants
 - Students' Access and Equity programs
- Mesa2030 framework will guide planning for the next 10 years
 - The Roadmap to Mesa2030
 - Annual Program Review
- Building Projects:
 - English building that would include a student resource Center.
 - Performing arts building
 - Administration building
 - Student housing - optional
 - Conference Center
 - Each of those projects is clearly mapped to our five facilities planning principles

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Dr. Pam Luster additional feedback: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ There are two housing options shown on the future campus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ West side of campus ▪ East side of campus. ▪ Buildings aren't being prioritized because it is a matter of public support and soon there will be clarity on what it would look like across the district. ▪ The 2024 presidential election is a critical one that affects the budgets across the district. ▪ Another source of funding is through bonds where money is raised for the college to purchase property. ○ The hope is that all of our feedback is received by April 19th <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ We will start integrating that feedback into an updated draft that will come back to all of those groups in the first week of May. <p>2.
