A. Guided Pathways (GP):

- 1. Academic Senate President Kim Perigo reported the GP Task Force Faculty Members Howard Eskew, Mark Manasse, Kim Perigo, Cynthia Rico and Manuel Velez have been meeting with the task force weekly.
- 2. The Committee of Chairs reviewed the 14 elements of the self-assessment during their February 2018 meeting and selected elements 6, 8 and 9 as the most important.

B. Support for Parkland School Shooting Victims: Student Safety

- 1. Academic Senate President Kim Perigo reported Languages Department Senators Leela Bingham and Hannah Padilla approached her regarding Senate support for the Parkland Shooting victims.
 - a. Senate Secretary Inna Kanevsky reported the Academic Senate cannot take a political position.
 - Political positions are not part of 10+1 list of issues that are under our purview.
 - b. There was concern expressed that a letter would get lost in the sea of cards and letters that are being sent to the Parkland victims.
 - c. A few meeting attendees said the Senate should not send a letter.
 - d. There was concern expressed about whether the Senate will need to prepare a letter of support after every school shooting from now on.
 - e. Several Senate members expressed the need for Mesa College to create a safer environment for our own students.
 - f. Paula Gustin said Mesa College is lagging behind in regards to safety training and we need support from administration to create a safety training plan for Mesa College.
 - g. Toni Parsons said the ALICE active shooter training is fantastic and should be mandatory training.
 - h. Judy Sundayo reported College Police responded well to concerns regarding white supremacy fliers that were posted on campus.
 - Judy Sundayo also reported that the district has a threat assessment committee and Mesa College has a Crisis Response Team.
 - The Faculty and Staff Assessment Committee on Threats (FACT) is a Mesa College Academic Senate Standing Committee.

 - # 8 (Clear Program Requirements) CurriUNET Training & Working with Curriculum Review Committee (CRC) Experts
 - # 9 (Proactive & Integrated Academic/Student Support) Counseling Hot Spots/Referrals to Counseling/Etc.
- 3. The elements are listed with their plans, existing efforts to build on, outcomes and the resources needed to achieve the outcomes.
- 4. The implementation timeline is spring 2018 to summer 2019.
- 5. A draft funding allocations list is part of the draft plan. (The numbers are arbitrary)
- 6. The plan briefly describes the college's efforts regarding the following:
 - The inclusion of high school grades into the assessment/placement process.
- 7. The task force will answer the following optional question during their final meeting.
 - Based on the college's planning and self-assessment dialogue and activity, what support could the Chancellor's Office provide to expand or support the next steps
