

- VII. ROUND TABLE TOPIC: Academic Senate Scholarship Application Criteria (B. Arnold)
  - **A.** Becca Arnold reported that she and Holly Jagielinski evaluated the 2019 Academic Senate Scholarship applications and they are concerned that the current criteria are not broad enough.
    - 1. The Senators provided their feedback.

- IX. NEW BUSINESS:
  - A. DRAFT 2019-2022 Mesa College Technology Plan: Momilani Ramstrom & Duane Wesley

Mesa Information Technology (MIT) Committee:

- 1. Mimilani Ramstrum and Duane Wesley encouraged the Senators to review the draft plan and provide their feedback.
  - a. The feedback will be shared with the MIT Committee.
  - b. Momilani Ramstrum will update the draft plan to include feedback she receives by April 4<sup>th</sup>.
- 2. The MIT Committee would like to get a sense that the Academic Senate supports the draft plan during the April 8<sup>th</sup> meeting.
- 3. Duane Wesley reported the draft plan is a snap shot of Mesa College's current technology infrastructure.
- 4. The Mesa College Technology Plan is updated every three (3) years.
- 5. Departments submit funding requests for technology needs in their Program Review.
  - a. The Budget Allocation of Resources Committee (BARC) reviews and approves or denies funding requests.
- 6. Duane Wesley said the MIT Committee can bring up failures to approve funding requests for technology.

#### B. Resolution 19.3.1: Response to CSU General Education Task Force (GETF) Recommendations: John Crocitti

- 1. John Crocitti reported the CSU created the GETF in 2016.
  - a. Jonathan McLeod reported the purpose was to streamline General Education (GE) requirements.
  - b. The task force met in secrecy.

As reported by Jonathan McLeod:

"SDSU History Department Chair Andrew Wiese has noted that no CSU faculty in programs and departments (History, Political Science, Ethnic Studies, and Women's Studies), offering courses that fulfill the American Institutions requirement were appointed to serve on the Task Force. The one ASCCC appointed member teaches physical geography and the one ASUC appointee is a psychologist. Historians who sought admission to the final meeting of the Task Force, in Long Beach during February 2019, were barred from entry."

- 2. The CSU GETF is recommending that the number of required American Institutions units be reduced.
  - a. The recommendation impacts Black Studies, Chicano Studies, History and Women's Studies and may also impact Humanities courses.
  - b. Bruce Naschak said this sounds like Guided Pathways.
- 3. The CSU GETF's recommendations need to vetted throughout the entire CSU system.
- 4. John Hoskins and Inna Kanevsky provided amendments to the resolution.
- 5. The resolution asks the Academic Senate for California Community College (ASCCC) to create a resolution that opposes the CSU GETF recommendation to reduce the number of units for American Institutions GE requirement.

- C. Resolution 19.3.2: Senate Exec Officers Eligibility to Run for Office Constitutional Amendments: M. Velez (The original Resolution 19.2.1 was tabled on March 4, 2019.)
  - 1. Only Tenured Faculty are currently eligible to run for Academic Senate Executive Officer positions.
  - 2. Faculty Members who will become Tenured Faculty in the fall semester should be eligible to run for the offices of Secretary, Senator at Large and Treasure in the spring semester while they are still Tenure-Track Faculty.
  - 3. They will be Tenured Faculty when their term of office begins in the fall semester.

  - a. Campus Solutions Hands on Training:
    - Margarita Sanchez and her team provided hands on training for the Department Chairs on March 13<sup>th</sup>.
  - b. February 27th Enrollment Management Meeting:
    - VPI O'Connor attended the February 27<sup>th</sup> Enrollment Management meeting.
    - VPI O'Connor asked the Department Chairs to share their concerns and thoughts regarding Enrollment Management during the meeting.

  - a. Automatic Awarding of Degrees:
    - Andrew Hoffman asked what is the best way to contact students.
    - Inna Kanevsky said students should be able to opt-in for multiple emails and traditional mail.
    - Holly Jagielinski said students need to be assigned a district email account that does not change while they are attending Mesa, City and/or Miramar College.
    - Being awarded a degree impacts a student's Financial Aid status.
    - Henry Browne said automatically awarding a student with an Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) can take a student in the wrong direction.
      - \* Thekima Mayasa said we need to inform students when they create their Ed. Plans.
  - b. DRAFT Board Policy 5020- Curriculum Development:
    - Please add as New Business to the April 8<sup>th</sup> agenda for Academic Senate review.
  - c. Multiple Degree Awards:
    - Thekima Mayasa said Black Studies Majors can earn a second degree with approximately nine (9) additional units.
    - Helen Greenbergs said Mesa College should align with other colleges.
    - Toni Parsons asked if the conversation should be about additional classes instead of additional units, especially since some Language and Math classes are five (5) unit classes.
    - Carlynne Allbee said it should be a minimum of three (3) classes or 12 units.
