**Resolution 2026.4.3 - Advocating for the Establishment of a Districtwide Safety Committee:** SDMC AS

**WHEREAS**, maintaining a safe and secure learning and working environment is essential to student success, employee well-being, and the overall mission of San Diego Mesa College and the San Diego Community College District; and

**WHEREAS**, safety concerns across district campuses and sites, including emergency preparedness, campus security, facilities hazards, risk mitigation, and health-related risks, require consistent coordination, communication, and oversight; and

**WHEREAS**, safety efforts that are decentralized or unevenly implemented across colleges and district sites may result in gaps in policy alignment, response protocols, training, and resource allocation; and

**WHEREAS**, a districtwide safety committee composed of faculty, classified professionals, administrators, and other relevant stakeholders would promote participatory governance, transparency, collaborative problem-solving, and consistent attention to safety issues across the district;

**RESOLVED**, that the Academic Senate of San Diego Mesa College formally advocate for the creation of a Districtwide Safety Committee within the San Diego Community College District; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that the Districtwide Safety Committee include equitable representation from faculty, classified professionals, administrators, and, where appropriate, students and other relevant stakeholders, to ensure diverse perspectives in safety planning and decision-making; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that the Districtwide Safety Committee be charged with reviewing and recommending policies and practices related to campus safety, emergency preparedness, facilities hazards, risk mitigation, health standards, training, and compliance with applicable state and federal regulations; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that the Districtwide Safety Committee facilitate regular communication among campuses and district sites, share best practices, support consistency in safety protocols, and receive appropriate institutional support and resources to sustain its effectiveness.
