TITLE: REVIEW OF THE COLLEGE'S MISSION STATEMENT

INTRODUCTION

The 2004 Standard I for Accreditation deals with Institutional Mission and Effectiveness.

Standard IA.3 states "using the institution's governance and decision-making processes, the institution reviews its mission statement on a regular basis and revises it as necessary". The purpose of this position paper is to provide guidance for the regular review and revision as necessary of the San Diego Mesa College Mission and Goals. The review of the mission statement has been assigned to the Academic Affairs Committee by the President's Cabinet.

PROCESS

The process for review of the San Diego Mesa College Mission Statement will be guided by the following criteria:

- 1. The mission statement will be reviewed every two years (starting spring 2003) unless circumstances dictate otherwise.
- 2. A subcommittee of Academic Affairs and at least one (1) representative from each of the participatory governance bodies will be responsible for this review. This subcommittee should also include the Self-Study Chair of the standard responsible for the mission statement in an accreditation year.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE REVIEWING COMMITTEE

- 1. The committee will develop criteria for regular review of the mission statement, and circumstances that would prompt changes to the mission statement.
- 2. Using these criteria, the committee will evaluate the current mission statement.
- 3. At the conclusion of its review, the committee will present its report to the Academic Affairs Committee.
- 4. The Academic Affairs Committee will present its recommendations for approval to the Academic Senate and then to the President's Cabinet.
- 5. Once approved, the results of the review of the mission statement will be published.
- 6. If the mission statement is revised, the established procedure for approval by the governing board will be followed.

DEVELOPING THE CRITERIA FOR REVIEW OF THE MISSION STATEMENT

When developing the criteria for the regular review of the mission statement, the following items should be considered:

- 1. The mission statement follows the parameters established by the State and District mission statements and the requirements of accreditation standards.
- 2. The mission statement defines Mesa College's broad educational purposes.
- 3. The mission statement indicates Mesa College's intended student population.
- 4. The mission statement describes Mesa College's commitment to achieving student learning.
- 5. The mission statement supports Mesa College's planning and decision-making processes.

MISSION STATEMENT AND GOALS Revised - October 3, 2005

San Diego Mesa College is a member of the California Community College system and a campus of the San Diego Community College District. Mesa College is committed to providing excellent educational programs and services to its students and the community.

San Diego Mesa College cultivates relationships to assess the needs of its total community in order to offer programs for the benefit of a diverse student body, including new and continuing, as well as those wishing to reenter the educational process. These community relationships, such as high school outreach and partnerships with business and industry, as well as transfer preparation to four-year institutions, provide grounds for a multilateral investment in our students as they move along the continuum from academics to career.

The College is committed to providing the highest quality of education and services designed to promote access, retention, and student success. Through participatory governance, all segments of the college engage in ongoing dialogue about quality, learning assessment, and implementation of institutional changes to improve student success. This success is supported by the College's Student Learning Outcomes at the Associate Degree level and includes critical thinking; communication, self-awareness and interpersonal skills; personal actions and civic responsibility; global awareness; and technological awareness.

The primary mission of San Diego Mesa College is to provide:

- Programs which lead to an Associate Degree or Certificate,
- Lower division curricula in arts and sciences with an emphasis on courses which transfer to baccalaureate institutions,
- Programs in career and technical education, and
- Programs that promote regional economic development.

To further this mission, educational programs and services offered by San Diego Mesa College include:

General Education, Associate Degree Majors, and Transfer Education: Courses and programs which contribute to the broad education of career, technical and transfer students. Included are critical thinking, writing, and oral communication skills; the ability to use and understand quantitative analysis; awareness of the arts and humanities; understanding of diversity, personal and civic responsibility, and of the physical, social, and behavioral sciences as they affect one's participation in the diverse local and global community.

<u>Basic Skills</u>: Courses and programs which prepare students, including native and non-native speakers of English, for college level reading, writing, speaking, and mathematics, as well as other programs designed to enable those with special learning needs to reach their educational goals.

<u>Student Services</u>: Admission, orientation, assessment, advising and counseling, tutorial, and other services which assist students in the matriculation process; including helping students select programs and courses that help satisfy their transfer and/or career goals and offering services that promote access, retention and student success.

<u>Co-curricular Activities</u>: Courses, programs and activities that further the students' learning experience through the practical implementation of curriculum-based methods, theories, and concepts resulting in the enrichment of both students' development and campus life.

<u>Economic and Career Development</u>: Courses, as well as degree and certificate programs, that advance California's economic growth and global competitiveness through education, training, and services that contribute to continuous work force improvement.

San Diego Mesa College uses its Mission Statement as a guide to continue its regular cycle of analysis and evaluation of its character, purpose, programs and resource allocation. Thus, the Mission Statement is the primary force to institutional planning, leading to enhanced student learning.

Through participatory governance, Mesa College is proud to provide an excellent and nurturing work environment to encourage and facilitate employee development and self-esteem. San Diego Mesa College also recognizes the contributions of all employees toward ensuring student success.
