#### Agenda Item 3: Welcome/Introductions:

#### DISCUSSION

- September birthdays: Zulma and Naayieli have birthdays this month.
   Attendees sang happy birthday and enjoyed birthday pastries. Naayieli absent and will send her a card and flowers.
- Lieu introduced guest Dean Larry Maxey to present the new equity plan.
- New Equity Plan:
  - Context: State requires that every college produce an equity plan every 3 years.
  - Previous plan had short and long term goals, very dense document.
     New plan is designed around the formatting of the Nova website.
     Previously, the college had to determine which groups were disproportionally impacted (based on enrollment levels, the success of that group should be proportionate to the enrollment of that group. If 10% of students are African-American, 10% of graduates should be African American. This is not the case.
  - o In new format, the state chancellor determines which groups are disproportionally impacted.
  - o Equity vs. equality:
    - Equality means everyone gets the same thing
    - Equity means people get what they need (bicycle graphicbicycle fits the person riding)
    - The world is not equal, there are historical systems that impact/marginalized some groups
      - Placement tests- previous tests were disproportionately placing African American and Latinx students into lower-level Math and English courses
      - 2. As an experiment, students who would've been placed lower were put into 101 level classes and given additional support- these students then passed at the same rate as the rest of the students in the classes
      - 3. Institutional structures were biased against certain groups of students
    - Equity is designed to bring in tools that will "fix barriers and intentionally provide support"
  - Highlights/snapshot
    - Aspirational- we are setting the bar high for ourselves;
    - Conservative- when the data is not clear we take a conservative approach (for example, we don't have data about LGBTQ, it is difficult to set goals with not data)
    - Inquiry: if data is vague or unclear, we will do more inquiry into who the students are
      - Some students may not report if they don't want to be categorized into a group- we don't have data on those students

- Metrics Mesa is considering: successful enrollment, retention, transfer, completion of transfer level math/English, earned credit certificate,
- Limitations: only so much resources, we are not receiving additional funding
  - We can't develop new programs, but we can expand other programs or offer more specific services within programs we already have.
    - 1. Importance of all employees being helpful and equity-minded.
- Definition of equity
- Classified Professionals have power to be involved, make connections and impact students. Classified Professionals can be a part of the "choir" that are loud about what is needed to help students
