- a) President- Charlie Lieu
 - Compassion It Workshop- Lieu shared the "Compassion it" workshop at Mesa on 1/15/2020 was well attended. This event was offered by the District Office Professional Development Department and was made possible by the Classified School Employee Professional Development Block Grant provided through Assembly Bill (AB) 1808. The "Compassion It" event provided for an opportunity for classified to learn mindfulness and meditation techniques to help promote: self-compassion and resiliency, stress management, compassion for others, and intrinsic bias reduction. The techniques help with improving workplace culture and enhancing individual classified engagement and resilience. Several workshops were provided at different campuses.
 - "Know Your Why" Workshop- Lieu shared that the workshop was a follow up to the Career Advancement event. President Luster and Vice President Hands presented an interactive personal growth workshop to classified professionals where they engaged in seeking to understand one's "why" and identifying strengths to cultivate our "why" in one's work and professional development. There was a large participation for this event of at least 30-40 people.
 - Mid-year assessment Recap- This form was shared with all classified senate members in attendance and asked for their participation in providing feedback to the Executive Board. The Executive Board reviewed the feedback and used it to inform future 2020 planning. One common piece of feedback from members is that they enjoyed the classified social events planned last fall and would like to see more of them in the spring. There was a request for even more off campus events to build camaraderie.
 - IEPI Spring Visit- This visit is to help all gain an understanding of how
 we work together. The IEPI Peer Resource Team (PRT) is visiting this
 spring to help us with our efforts to integrate Equity and Guided
 Pathways into our Mesa 2030 planning.
 - Mesa Scholarships- The deadline is approaching soon. Encourage students to sign up. The Student Affairs team is available to do a 10-15 minute overview of the scholarships available and instructions on how to apply. In addition, the Classified Senate scholarship is available to full-time, part-time, and work-study professionals who participate in lifelong learning to better serve our students, departments, and the college.
