Environmental review, including gnat catcher and yerba santa will be important. Maybe Mark Berninger from the city can provide a statement. Question-approval from city or college? Tentative approval from the city for the trail, but we need college approval. Maintenance, via partnership with city parks, to make sure trails stay clear. Trails will be useful to those teaching biology.
