  - 72 degrees is considered the "ideal" temperature.
    - -- If outdoor temperature is higher than 75 degrees, keep the classrooms temperatures around 75 degrees.
    - -- If the outdoor temperature is between 69 and 75 degrees, don't heat or cool the classrooms.
    - -- If outdoor temperature is lower than 69 degrees, keep the classrooms temperatures around 69 degrees.
    - -- During nights and weekends, don't heat or cool the classrooms.
