	A. SEA Report (Crakes)	
	 Deans from Student Success & Equity, Basic Skills and Student Success & Support Program has been working together to prepare a cohesive report to demonstrate an integrated plan of working together with other programs as it relates to funds provided in serving students. Report was submitted on December 12th; ready for review and approval by Mesa College President and Vice President of Administration. Once approved, an official report will be available to view. 	
COMMENTS/ DISCUSSION	 B. Taskforce Updates (Maxey) Resiliency Fund: This funding will provide more flexible provision to promote and support the persistent of our students. Funding will be provided as a one-time grant opportunity up to \$500 as a starting point in this new emergency relief program. Policy and procedures has been drafted and being forwarded to VPA for review along with other constituents. More updates will continue to be provided along the way. Stand Planning (The Stand Resource Center): Opening has been pushed back to fall 2020. This taskforce is designed to help determine how the resource center is going to be operated in terms of clothing, food and utilizing another side for workshops. Plans to provide community resources are in the process. The Stand is currently operating out of about 360 sq. ft. and the new location will be four times the current space. The Resiliency Fund Taskforce and The Stand Resource Center Taskforce have now completed their work. 	

 Scholarship Evaluation Training/Workshop: As reported from SET meeting in November, more meetings are being scheduled and plans are in the process to provide trainings in spring 2020 and will be available as flex workshops. Management Association: Taken the lead to modify the application process for students to make it as equitable as possible. A decision to lower GPA on Scholarships has been agreed. There will be more discussion on opening scholarships to part-time students in regards to units. Submission of an essay will not be the only option now; as another option, a video documenting their leadership experiences or hardships they have overcome will be offered.
