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COMMENTS/ DISCUSSION	 Food/Clothing Pantry A survey was taken by students to determine the level of struggle a student may have in obtaining food The Food Pantry is located on the second floor; across from the Engagement Center Initiated by Claudia Estrada and Johanna Aleman First clothing drive for veterans in November Contributions of non-perishable food and clothing drive will be greatly appreciated by everyone Peter Lofthouse inquired if there is a possibility of offering a "meal plan" of a flat rate through Financial Aid for students to be able to use at the new Mesa Commons; Peter will look into which college provides meal plans as a guide Summer CRUISE Program Outcomes: students feel connected to the college, provide instructional support and mentoring all year long The event was for 4 days, 160 students participated, 10 workshops/activities, 50 faculty & staff volunteered along with 7 peer navigators Large number of Hispanics participated Most participates were females Targeting to increase number of African American students 2016 CRUISE Engagement and Preparation for 384 students Morning and evening CRUISE; evening pilot was successful Integration of International Students New space Coming soon: Winter CRUISE, January 10-12, 2017 for 100 new students; CRUISE into Mesa, January 14, 2017 for 150 transitional students
