SEPIA- Student Equity Project in Action (Sundayo) Proposing a collaboration between CDAIE, UMOJA, Puente, Black Studies and the Chicano Studies Department Project Rationale Students gain inspiration from successful individuals who look like them Students respond positively to encouragement We'll never know if students are accessing support services unless we ask them or track them Teaching students about diversity and collaboration starts with us Will be rolling out in stages Spring 2017: student identification and orientation to include inspirational speakers Fall 2017: Career Exploration

- Spring 2018: Counseling Life Map; workshops, career assessment, targeted career and job shadow opportunities
- Fall 2018: SEPIA Circles; SDSU CBB, UCSD Partners, Jegneships (African term for mentorship) and Peer Partners
