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UPDATES	 Student Equity Planning We're working with CUE to develop change agent groups focused on English. We're walking in students' shoes; reflecting on our program reviews; and looking at our service areas to consider what we see and how accessible they are. This is a year of inquiry for us. What do our students experience through an equity lens?
	 Title V/Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSI) Grant HSI is in a design and development phase this year. Folks are participating in training.

UPDATES	 Program Review Good job getting your Program Reviews in on time. 95 program reviews were due; 93 were submitted. Great! Program Review surveys will go out soon. Planning and Institutional Effectiveness (PIE) There's a new Institutional Planning Manual. The integrated planning schedule for Spring 2015 was distributed. Faculty Hiring: Now comprised of 5 deans and 5 faculty. The first meeting will be held this Friday. Classified Hiring: We received 49 applications this year. Student Services Hiring Status: Julie projected a chart that provided an overview of new positions and those in the hiring queue. Budget and Resource Allocation Committee (BARC) No update Learning Assessment Task Force (LATF) No update
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UPDATES	 Point of Service Surveys, 2014-2015 We will collect feedback related to continuous improvement this year. The process will be Mesa-based and will be available online or in hard copy. We need to develop some shared questions this spring, but we also want to look at how we might frame them to respond to questions individual departments have. We might pick out a few existing satisfaction questions (per the District's request), but we also want to look at other kinds of questions. We could ask about SLO-related skills, knowledge, and awareness. Question: Will our departments be able to determine when these will be distributed? Answer: These will likely be available at all times. Question: Are we able to ask open-ended questions? Answer: Yes. Consider the following: How are departments currently assessing? What instrument are departments using? How might we assess students who don't receive services? There are assessments in addition to POS surveys - metacognitive testing, for example. Next steps: Identify SLOs that could be measured by additional survey items; work with the Research office; prepare for Fall 2015 implementation.
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	Areas should think about how they'd like to adapt the survey instrument to
	their areas. Bri will send out Google forms to collect our responses.

	 Academic Skills Center/Sampaga Languages tutoring is located in the Languages Center.
	 Admissions, Veterans, Records/Sawyer The staff is busy enrolling special populations. Our headcount is currently 23,684.
	 Career & Evaluations/Demcho Career has been conducting outreach with instruction. Career will be offering a series of workshops each related to a different area of the career exploration process. Will begin in March. The Career Opportunity Expo will be held April 13-16; Job Fair: April 16th.
UPDATES	 Counseling/Crakes We're finalizing our workshops for SSSP related to first semester ed planning, transfer prep, and AAT/AST degrees, for example. All is going well with the Ed Plan campaign. We've hired three new adjuncts to assist with SSSP efforts. Counseling faculty have planned a retreat to assess their SSSP efforts.
	 EOPS/Olvera The regional EOPS organization will soon host a classified staff training retreat to share best practices with each other.
	 Financial Aid/Maldonado The Student Services Fair will be held next week. We're looking to eliminate the rule that students with associate degrees are automatically disqualified from financial aid.

	 Instruction/McGrath The Board of Governors will give their final approval for the community college baccalaureate degrees on March 15th. We plan to accept the first cohort in Fall 2015. We're working on the summer schedule. We'll have between 500-600 sessions this summer. We are down about 150 FTES for the year.
	 Outreach/Esguerra Tomorrow is first in a series of Parents Nights. Three of these will be hosted in English and three in Spanish. Outreach is also cosponsoring a Black History Month event. We're enhancing preassessment/assessment in the high schools. We're developing a new process for FYE. Students will now fill out an application so they have a better understanding of what they're signing up for.
UPDATES	 Student Affairs/Hands Scholarship applications are due next Friday. The Scholarship Gala will be held on Friday, April 24th. We're currently planning for Commencement. Club Orientation will be this Friday. Students can register their clubs at this time.
	 Student Development/Topham The state is looking into a new Common Assessment. The next meeting will be held on March 9th. Two vendors' instruments include multiple and non-cognitive measures to more fully assess student preparedness. An online education group is looking at developing an online counseling component. Meetings begin next month. The group is considering a state-wide student portal.
	 Student Health Services/Khambata We have a flu center set up; Be Calm will be held every week.
	 Transfer/Johnson We'll be starting appeal workshops soon. If you have students who need transfer assistance, send them to the Transfer Center.
