COMMENTS	The District is hosting a campaign, "The Summer is Back." This has been posted in games and on other online platforms. One ambassador saw an ad featuring herself on Pandora. COMMENTS	 Summer Planning We will be holding our 3rd annual SS retreat this summer, probably sometime in July. Stay tuned for possible dates. We have a great opportunity to advance and improve our SSSP and Equity Plans. Our peers in the state have reviewed all 112 SSSP and Equity Plans and we'll be getting both feedback and a new template. We've gone through a whole year in our work. This summer, we'll have a great opportunity to incorporate what we've learned and to develop our plans. The Center for Urban Ed will help us integrate our SSSP, equity, and Title V efforts.

COMMENTS	 Fall 2015 In the fall we'll have the opportunity to move forward with implementation of our coordinated plans. We'll be paying closer attention to our data working to close the gaps with particular populations as a part of and beyond the scope of our plan. In working with the Minority Male Initiative, we've gathered survey results from students. We did focus groups and will try to survey more students this summer. We'll get reports, share information, and the MMI folks will develop professional development plan. We're recruiting for in-class tutors for basic skills English, math, and astronomy. Get the word out if you know of students who might be good fits. Why these classes? Bri recently shared a chart of gateway classes with high D, F, W rates. These are the classes that students need to progress.

At President's Cabinet yesterday, it became more tangible that these numbers represent our <i>students</i> . Many reflected on this at the meeting. We'll be setting our own goals in Student Services.
	 Hiring – Current and New Larry Maxey will begin on June 1. We will soon be launching a search for his Senior Secretary. Student Development will be hiring 2 more general counselors, 1 veterans' counselor, and 4 Student Services Techs. We're waiting for approval to post these. The Program Activity Manager apps will be reviewed on Friday. We'll be hiring a Student Services Coordinator/Counselor for FYE. We have 2nd Interviews for a Student Services Specialist the first week of June. This is an academic supervisor position.
