	 Student Affairs ASG/Clubs: This week the ASG is hosting a suggestion board near the cafeteria. Elections will be held early May. The ASG is also holding a Mesa Olympics event on May 5 in the Mesa Circle from 10-2. This is for clubs and students, but all should feel free to join. The ASG gave out \$12,000 worth of scholarships. They want to increase student rep fee by \$1 (from \$1 to \$2) and donate this to the state organization. Financial Aid: Cash in on Community College will be held on 4/30 from 9:00-1:00. The Financial Literacy program will now be under Student Equity/Larry Maxey. Financial Aid is downloading 16-17 FAFSAs on April 30.
UPDATES	 workshops in March, meeting with six feeder schools, and finished them today. Karla has personally worked with 319 students. High Tech High School has taken part for the first time. Parents Information Nights are being held. This Saturday, Outreach is participating in the Linda Vista Parade. Student Health Services: Therapists are out in front of the cafeteria to talk to students. The Comfort Tent will be held May 9th. On an ongoing basis, SHS will host Be Calm on Thursdays in the SHS office. The office has crisis counseling if anyone needs assistance. Student Affairs: The Scholarship Banquet will be held this Friday. There's still time to buy tickets and drop off a basket. Commencement will follow soon after. Testing and Assessment: The hours have been extended to 7:00, Monday through Thursday.
	 Student Development Admissions, Veterans, and Records: The SST position is in the works for the Allied Health Program and part time staff are back. The paper schedule for summer is available as of today. The online schedule was posted on April 12. Appointments will be sent via email on April 29. Summer registration starts on May 9. Veterans is looking at its goals and how it delivers its services. The USD program, Soldiers that Salsa, will be brought to Mesa.

 Counseling: Students are accessing more services and two new adjunct counselors have been hired. The department is holding a retreat this Friday. "Six Steps to Success" has been finalized. Counseling is holding BOGW workshops for students every day through June 17. TEC: On May 2, the Transfer Center will hold Transfer Options Day with about 35 universities for students who weren't admitted to public universities. The Transfer Recognition Luncheon will be held on May 12. Bus trips are also planned: April 29: Grand Canyon University and UCLA for the Stomp Conference; May 7th: UCSD. The department is participating in Michelle Obama's College Signing Day on April 26th. On that day, let's wear our Alma Mater sweatshirts or hats. 78 employers participated in the Job Fair, and they conducted 200 interviews. Each employer saw about 55 students. 47 students stopped by the clothing drive booth. Career gave away 147 clothing items over a 12-hour period, and this may continue throughout the year. Veterans Resource Center: The VRC held a pancake social last month and raised around \$800 for the Veterans Emergency Fund.
 Student Success & Equity Student Equity: SSE has implemented a number of activities this year and is prepared to start looking at data. The department will continue to develop activities to benefit our disproportionately impacted students. M2C3 has presented data with much work left to do. CUE has presented some findings related to how faculty and staff are perceiving equity work. Title V/HSI: Summer CRUISE is slated for Aug 1-4; 8-1. DSPS: Next Thursday, DSPS will host a movie screening at 6:00 in the High Tech Center on the 1st floor of the LRC. It is based on one of our amazing DSPS students, a jazz musician with autism. EOPS: EOPS currently has 652 students. The department is working with Former Foster Youth. STAR/TRiO: The exit surveys are coming in. Staff are evaluating services that were offered this year.
