Student Services

• Tech Update: Status of Ask Mesa an FAQ system for Student Services: We've gotten 400 questions asked. 80% are being linked to appropriate answer. Of the 20% that aren't answered, many are able to find what they need with a further suggestion prompted by the system. This is a good result for a beta launch.

UPDATES

Student Affairs

- ASG/Clubs: ASG held elections the first week in May.
- Financial Aid: HIM has been Title IV approved which means it is eligible for financial aid. For the 15-16 year, FA got an additional 197,000 for the SEOG program and 23,000 for new CalGrant B recipients. 18,000 FAFSA applications for 16-17.

- Outreach & Community Relations: Had a successful Cash in on Community College event. 200 students attended. Just wrapped up Parents Nights with 1200 visitors to the Mesa table. If you know a good candidate for ambassadors, let Karla know.
- Student Health Services: SHS will host a retreat next week. The Comfort Tent will be active until Thursday.
- Student Affairs: Just completed another successful commencement.
 We had 40 more graduates walk the stage than we had last year.
 SDCCD will participate in the Pride Parade this year. Come and march, Saturday, July 6.

Student Development

- Admissions, Veterans, & Records: Headcount for those who attempted to register or registered: 7,179 for summer. Deadline for international students is June 1st for fall semester. VA is busy certifying students. The deadlines for grades is May 27. There will be a 4-week intersession in the month of January.
- Counseling: The department is very busy. First-year students will be meeting this week. The 10-month counselors will be leaving this week. Raul Rodriguez will be assuming responsibility for Puente on July 1st. We're busy closing out FastTrack. Summer will be a busy time we'll be providing online scheduling of appointments.
- Transfer/Evaluations/Career: Transfer Day will be held on October 4th and Transfer Night on November 15th. The department recently held a successful Transfer Recognition Luncheon. Career workshop registration is being streamlined. For transfer and career fairs, the department will be using Guidebook, a tool that allows students to connect with employers or to plan their fair experiences. Pilot begins this summer for students who have an internship and would like units and to be paid. Students want internships but don't know how to get them. We're moving away from Job Connect. We just completed commencement and are starting to plan for next year.
- Veterans Resource Center: Staffing VRC for summer.

Student Success & Equity

- Student Equity: The State Chancellor's office has made extra money available that we will take advantage of. We will be reinstituting CALWorks, possibly in 16-17. Johanna has been working on a food pantry project. We may offer some clothes, as well. Our EOPS director position was approved last week at the Board.
- Title V/HSI: We've concluded Peer Navigator interviews. Paperwork is being process for 20 navigators. We anticipate having over 350 students for Summer CRUISE.
- DSPS: Held grad breakfast last Tuesday. Have enjoyed being part of parents information nights. We are knee-deep in proctoring. We have two new SSA starting June 1.

EOPS: The EOPS achievement dinner on Friday went very well. About
70 people attended. They awarded sashes and pins. Students were
awarded grants this past week, \$400-\$800.
 STAR/TRIO: They are standing room only for a place to study. The
student club participated in the WESTOP student conference.
