- Everyone started with a mission they all believed in and developed SSOs.
- Up to now, program review and outcomes assessment have been separate; the program coordinator did this work independently. Now the connections are clear between program review and outcomes and that these processes should involve everyone in the departments
- SSPOs: A program is something with a cohort. The ambassadors are the cohort. What do we want our students to have learned once they've been an ambassador for a year.
