#### Guided Pathways Work Plan

• The Guided Pathways Work Plan has been drafted, vetted through the governance groups, and approved at President's Cabinet yesterday. It will be submitted to the State by the deadline: March 30. It is a plan for the first 18 months of the Mesa Pathways work we'll be doing. We will focus on six elements and the projects identified in the plan (attached).

#### SS Evacuation Debrief

- The SS Center evacuated on March 13<sup>th</sup> due to a power outage. The SS Center safety work group shared the comments.
- We have tentatively scheduled a full evacuation on Wednesday, May 30 at 2:00. We still need police confirmation for this date.
- We are working on purchasing radios and necessary supplies for all emergency leads.

## **AGENDA ITEM IV: Student Services Updates**

Student Services: The budget funding formula is in flux. A new suggested plan would move us to funding based on enrollment, low socioeconomic status, and completion (50%/25%/25%). Advocacy groups including college CEOs are advocating for a phased in process to lead to an enrollment/income & outcomes funding formula of 75%/25%.

- M&M: Pi Day for March was amazing! We will have a Spring Roll Party in April. Bring a tasty treat that are rolled or rollable.
- Tech Update: OU forms feature: Charlie has created a video tutorial for how to use this feature.

#### Student Affairs:

- AS: The AS is funding the LEAD Series, led by Dr. Tanis Starck.
- Financial Aid: FA concluded its Campus Solutions; soft live April 23.
   On April 24, student notifications will go out. In June, we'll run SAP and notify students if they're disqualified. We have received funding for the College Completion Grant. Many students didn't receive funds because they didn't have ed plans. A letter will go out to encourage students to get an ed plan at General Counseling or in a categorical program. The goal of the completion grant is to help students complete in two years.
- Outreach/Community Relations: The Ambassadors are out and about assisting students with their applications and placement. After students complete the placement assistant, they are informed about all SS programs. All students want to get onto CRUISE! Thanks for making our Mesa Information Nights successful.
- Student Health: We will have an opening position for a mental health coordinator.

- Jumpstart Cash-In 2018: 300 students attended. We needed to move it inside, but it turned out to be a blessing. The event went so well.

- Admissions/Veterans/Records: We are busy working on admissions for second eight week session and special programs.

- Career: Career is busy with Strong Workforce. The Center is working jointly to beef up the Career Tech program at Mesa.

#### **Student Success & Equity**

- AVANZA/CRUISE/Peer Navigators: AVANZA will be closed in April for the remodel. We are completing a great Peer Navigator hiring season. This will be a difficult year for making decisions about peer navigators since the pool was very rich. Natchel has been nominated for Woman of the Year by Lorena Gonzalez Fletcher. We will be hiring a SSSA in AVANZA.
- DSPS: We've been working with different areas to help faculty understand the accommodation process. We have a new test proctor: Erick Escalante. He's doing great in his new role.
- EOPS: Eight students attended a regional leadership conference. We are receiving great feedback from folks attending Foster Care Week. An undocumented student support group has been created. We met with Angell foundation; they love what Sade and Foster Youth students are doing – we have received funding again.
- Student Equity: To-date The Stand has provided services to almost 500 students. We visited MiraCosta's farmer's market. It is a great model. It's helping us to develop ours. We will have more detailed information soon.
- STAR TRIO: STAR submitted its annual performance report to the U.S.
   Dept of Education. We are following up on students who are having academic challenges or have dropped out.
