# Campus/District Updates As information rolls in about the new funding formula, the VP will keep us posted. Promise: Thanks to Genevieve and Miriam and all others who are making Promise work. We have about 700 incoming students and 150 from our first cohort. In addition to paying fees, Mesa provides wraparound services, like CRUISE and the requirement that Promise students take a PERG class. Promise takes a holistic approach to the student. # Transfer Report Highlight: Mesa has a 42% transfer rate – higher than most colleges. 2153 students transferred in 16-17. We are working with National to establish stronger pathways through our partnerships. Mesa Journey Demonstration Since our retreat in the summer, our Mesa Journeys tool has incorporated 18 additional Mesa programs (now the tool refers to 28 services). Using the tool, students respond to simple questions and receive instant results of services we offer and can also save their reports. Program managers will have access to this data. When using the data, be mindful of what you send students (the size of emails, that it includes an opportunity to opt out, that email

- addresses are sent on the BCC line. Also be mindful of the security of the information.
- Make sure your webpages are speaking to your students. This tool and others will direct students to your sites. Make sure your website speaks to them and uses accessible languages.
- Charlie has log-ins for all students.
- This tool is mobile friendly.

- Financial Aid: We are disbursing 2,422 checks. The District is upfronting this money (they are estimated amounts).
- Outreach/Community Relations: All ambassadors are cleared to work; nine will be placed at a feeder HS or West City Continuing Ed. They have completed training. We look forward to presentations from our campus colleagues.

- Student Health: Students will be able to receive Free Physical Fridays. Soon our new mental health coordinator will begin.
- Testing and Assessment: We're very interested to see the data for students who were placed using the Placement Assistant.
- Promise: We have about 850 students for the entire Mesa Promise cohort. Only 22 students fell below the 12 unit requirements, and most of those were close to 12 units. Promise students are loving the Instagram account. Please follow us on Instagram. And, the department created an electronic progress report for faculty. Charlie was instrumental in creating this; it will be going live tomorrow.

- Student Equity: Direct support: have given out \$7,500 so far this semester. Our new SDICCCA intern will work on our equity website and our equity story.
- STAR TRIO: We received a 4.5% increase in funding. We serve 235 students making sure that those 235 have the best chance of graduating and transferring. Student use of facility is down by more than 10%. Right now. We're serving 132, so half of our targets. Our applications are down. We will ramp up our classroom outreach. We would like to highlight global consciousness through a monthly series of STAR student/worker presentations.
