Veterans & Records

- Call to Action: A Sense of Purpose
 - Goal: Increase the number of Black/African American student veterans participating in the VA Work Study Program.
 - Veteran students want to be part of something bigger than themselves; they want to give back; they want to bring to other students a better awareness of student services. Through this program, Black student veterans can bring this awareness to other students. The office has been recruiting for about nine months. This has increased applicants and hires. Being intentional about this makes our whole staff more inclusive. Students need to see others like them. Our goal is to keep this up and continue to increase our numbers.

CalWORKs

- CalWORKs is a California welfare-to-work program to promote self-sufficiency. The program is intentional about connecting with Black and African American students and connecting them to services and spaces like the Black Lives Matters websites and to Markus Berrien with the Black Faculty Counseling Collaborative. We look at the well-being of families. Not just students. We look at our biases.

- In 2018-2019, we looked at our stats for our scholarships. We learned that Black / African American students were underrepresented in scholarship awards. We are intentional about how we connect with and communicate with Black / African American students. Students receive a special "welcome back" letter; we share testimonies of other Black / African American students; we communicate with Black / African American professors. We expanded outreach strategies to include information sessions, office hours, and a video guide.
- We collaborated with MT2C to support students in writing their applications; we offered sessions at times that work for them – Fridays and weekday evenings.
- We reached out via social media, flyers, and emails to professors.

- We don't yet have a date for returning to campus. This is a very preliminary effort, so we're prepared. When time is right, we'll have a plan. To start, our capacity will be 25% at a time. We will eventually get to "orange" 50%. So, this will be staged. We will ask, Who needs to be on campus? Eventually, the question will be, When do we open doors to students? CRSSAA ("HEERF") Funding Requests

- This fund is meant to defray expenses related to COVID and to support our most economically vulnerable students.
- This is a time for us to dream and think about how we support all of our groups. Technology, multiyear contracts. We can be creative. Is there more we want to? Let's go. We can bring people on-board in the short-term to get things going and lay the foundation.
- You're encouraged to be creative. We are in the process of creating a way so that we can pay students when they serve as expert panelists. This is where we can start thinking outside of the box.
- The SS deans will work with their teams to meet the needs of our students where they are. We'll look at intentional ways to create the conditions that matter. We will hire adjuncts, buy software. Big things. But we also want to look at just-in-time interventions.
- Lorenze is working on a form so that even if we don't know everything now, smaller items can be requested later. There will be many opportunities big and small.
- What do students need? Rent? Utilities? What do specific populations need?
- Students will tell us what that need. We need to ask, listen, and respond.
- The Department of Ed is writing guidelines.
- We need to shift in our thinking from survival to thriving modes.
- We want to leave this time drastically improved for students.
- Mindblowingly innovative ideas anticipated.
- We want to reconnect with students who left and giving students resources for coming back with a focus on our most disproportionately impacted students.

Mesa Journeys Enhancements

- Students would like better communication about services. The Mesa Journeys team has acquired Constant Contact. We now have a Mesa Journey's dynamic newsletter.
- Once students complete survey, they will receive a list of programs or services that they can apply to or look at for support in their journeys.
- Students who have signed up, will now receive a newsletter tailored to each of them and to the programs and services that relate to them.
- Some information will go to all students (like scholarships); other information tailored to individual students.
- The newsletter can also connect to Social Media accounts and messages.
 This provides a one-stop email, so students aren't getting inundated with emails.
