August 2020

August 2020

September 2020

Peer Navigators came up with the most popular programs:

October 2020 – Spring 2021

- Compile all findings into a resource list
- PNs were asked to share findings with their African-American/Black CRUISErs during monthly one-on-one meetings
- Time was provided to allow for intentionality and authentic dialogue to develop
- Focus group with African-American/Black CRUISErs set for spring semester

Spring 2021 – April 2021

- Team provided bi-weekly updates to ensure progress
- PNs continued with their monthly meetings, sharing resources and encouraging CRUISErs to attend upcoming focus group
- Dean Maxey supported efforts by chatting with PNs

April 9th at 1:00PM and 14th at 4:00PM

- CRUISE data points to a need for more African-American/Black CRUISE participation
- We'd like to hear from you and what we can do
