- Please review to a recent email from VC Smith and share any question/comments with your deans. The Leadership Team meets weekly to discuss these comments.
- Please initiate the interactive process requested in the email. The goal is to make a reasonable accommodation when possible.
- Remote work in Spring is not likely to be approved. See the email you've received for more information, including timelines and action steps.
 - Per 10/25/21 EEOC:
 - Medical Exemptions: The District is looking for specific information about why an employee can't take the vaccine for a specific period of time. All current exemptions have been processed and employees have been notified.
 - Religious Exemption: Require a statement of religious belief. The District expects to have these all processed by 11/23/21.
 - HR will hold an informational session during the first week of December for managers and supervisors.

We expect to have about 1,800 courses in-person during the spring.

A. Return to Campus: Needs/Concerns Given the traffic we expect in the building, how will we manage capacities in spaces? How many days/week will we be here? What hours? This is a standing item on the SSLT agendas. This information should be discussed at the department level and be shared with Deans who will take it back to SSLT. We are open to making just-in-time shifts, as needed. We want to keep the dialogue open. We are still discussing service hours districtwide. Some options will be to pull back on evening hours. We might limit hours to 8-6. Working remotely on Fridays is unlikely to happen, but we may limit hours of face-to-face operations on those days.

- For many programs, the funding will come through General Funds. The Business Office will supply those funds (amount TBD). There are restrictions on these funds, so we may augment with equity or other funds.

- Tech Update: You'll find our live chat bot and agent on the home page; we now have a Paper Cut printer and a Kik scanner on the first floor. We continue to offer a <u>Constant Contact</u> training. We continue to work on our steps for the next iteration of Mesa Journeys.

Student Affairs

- Student Affairs: We disbursed Project Success moneys and will hold a
 Thanksgiving Feast. Each student will receive a to-go meal. Scholarships
 kick off Dec 6. We will have Commencement on campus this year.
- AS: We had a successful Homecoming. Today, we held a Warm and Fuzzy Distribution. Tomorrow, we will have the Thanksgiving Distribution from 2-4.
- Financial Aid: Next week will be the last appeals committee for the fall semester. There will be no FA disbursements during Thanksgiving Week.
 The last processing date for Fall will be December 10.
- Outreach & Promise: The Promise Program is now accepting early HS graduates.
- Testing & Assessment: Assessment is working with students needing to take challenge exams.

Student Development

- Student Development: Larry, Ailene, and Andy are working on the SEA report, due Jan 1.
- Admissions/Records: We are moving as fast as we can to support students in continuing with their journeys in all kinds of ways. Thanks for for providing your helping hands. We will start registering HS students on December 1. We have our initial CCAP rosters.
- Career/Evaluations: We created a <u>career flyer</u>. We have a new job board and two new team members. Please encourage students to apply for graduation. We are currently finishing up the effort to have a live chat.
- Counseling: It's taking about 120 days to evaluate transcripts. We are working on SARS texting. Terrance Hale will soon be our International Students liaison.
- Veterans/Veterans Success Center: Veterans Week was very successful.
 We had about 50 folks show up to the Center's grand opening and about the same number of students coming to workshops. We will complete our military-friendly survey process in early December. We are looking to move up to gold level over time.
- Transfer: The ADT Business 2.0 was just approved. This is very helpful to students trying to transfer. We received a Foundation Grant for application fee reimbursements. We are extending <u>lab hours</u> through December 15. Mesa was recognized recently for an important transfer award: Mesa College has been named a 2021 Equity Champion of Higher Education Mesa excels at awarding Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT) to Black and Latinx students

Student Success & Equity

- SSE: Larry presented to a professional team at the district focused on the success of Black students. The workgroup was very impressed with our Call to action.
- EOPS: Petra's retirement will be celebrated on Monday, Nov 29. We'll host a Dreamer's Resource Center grand opening on Tuesday, December

- 7 with a virtual option. Rising Scholars, NextUp, FAST, and Borderless Scholars will be presenting at the Fall 2021 HS Counselor Conference.
- DSPS: Thanks to The Stand for the workshop collaborations. Clockwork goes live next week. This will help students, including those who take classes across the District.
- The Stand: We're partnering with Student Affairs to hold another successful <u>Hunger and Homeless Awareness Week</u>. We are partnering with other offices to hold workshops related to a healthy return to campus. Basic Needs just received permanent funds by the state. There will be a food distribution in the parking garage tomorrow from 10-1.
