A. Student Equity Plan

- Every three years, we develop our new equity plan which details how we are mitigating disproportionate impact for students.
- The Equity Plan aligns with our other plans on campus, including Mesa2030. When we map to larger plan, we can be collectively intentional about reaching our goals and aspirations.
- We return to a focus on race our most disproportionately impacted groups.

UPDATES

- We view students from an asset perspective and work to eliminate barriers. We have an equity mindset. Our Equity definition includes how we'll know when we've achieved equity.
- Goals: Years 1 & 2: Rebuild community and sense of belonging for our DI'd groups to be measured qualitatively. Year 3: To close all equity gaps by 5%.
- Activities: Creating inclusive spaces; professional learning; basic needs; Guided Pathways (SSTs, data coaching, transfer/career). The plan is in its final draft stages. It will make its rounds and go to the District this semester.
