WHAT IS NEXTUP?

NextUp, also known as CAFYES (Cooperating Agencies Foster Youth Educational Support), provides community college students with resources that make a difference. The program offers eligible current and former foster youth support and services.



WHAT SERVICES ARE PROVIDED?

All services are in addition to EOPS/ CARE services

- Textbook support
- Health fees
- Parking permits
- Bus passes
- Unmet need grant
- Emergency grant
- Child care stipend
- Car repair

- Academic counseling
- Personal counseling

- Networking opportunities

The basic requirements:

- ❑You must be a current or former foster youth who was in care on or after age 16;
- □You must be under the age of 26 years old at the start of the academic year;
- □ Enroll in at least 9 units (6 units if DSPS);
- Qualify for EOPS; and
- Provide proof of dependency.
