Transfer Rate

A cohort of students with similar qualities over a specified time.



Transfer Volume

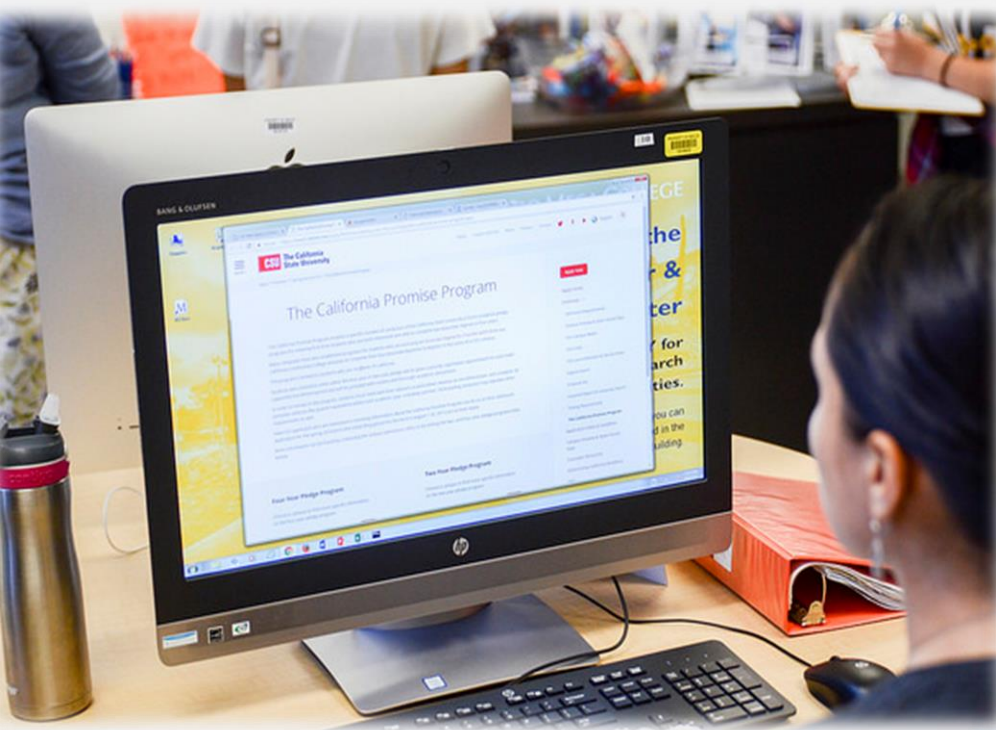
The sheer count of transfer students who have transferred from community college to a 4-year institution



Transfer Prepared

Students who do not transfer or obtain a degree but successfully complete 60 CSU/UC units with a G.P.A of greater than a 2.00

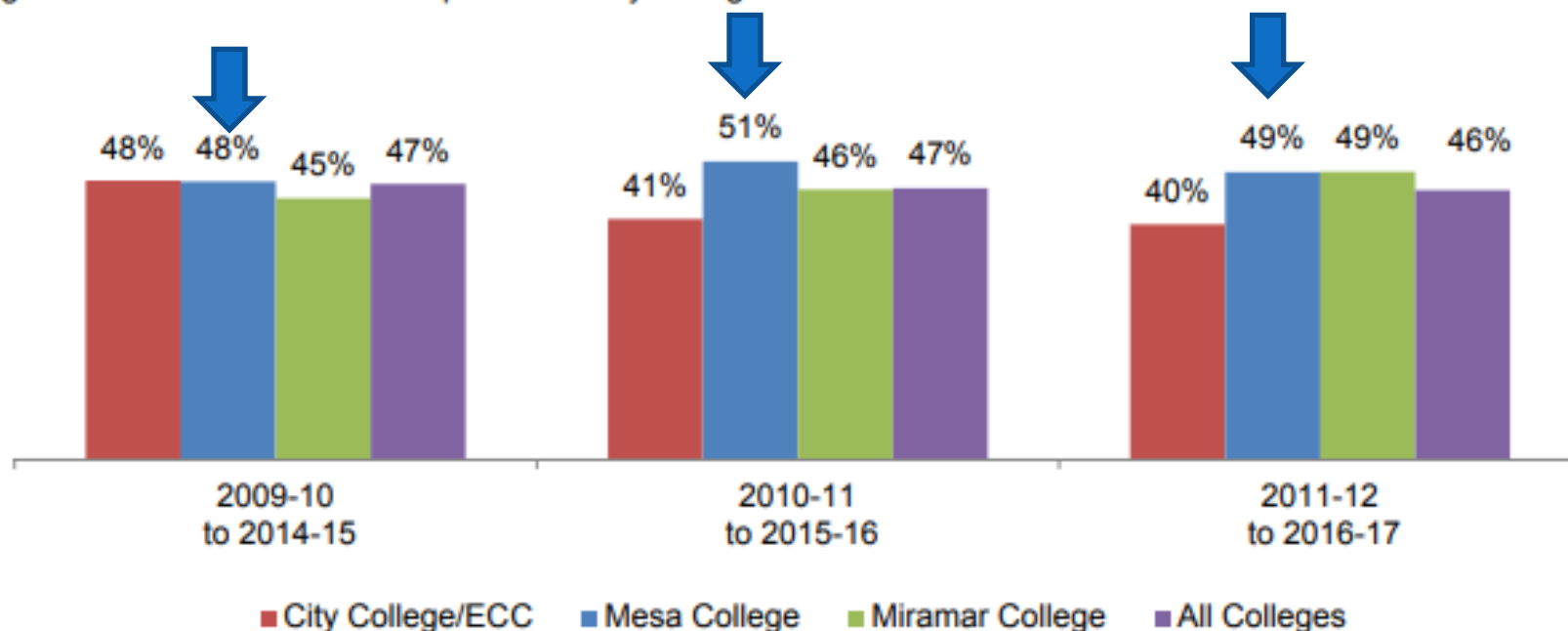
