 - Reminder of the 0.20 CTE Reassigned Time position- Strong Workforce. Announcement was sent by President Luster via email to all faculty. Deadline to submit letters of interest is Feb 28th, 2019.

Fall Campus Activities:

- Program Review integration: First time BARC process with CTE questions integrated. We have learned what
 we can do better for next year. Blythe Barton from Exercise Science-Dance shared that now that she has
 gone thru the entire Program Review experience, she understands more how everything works/links
 together.
- Hiring / Moving: The ILT for Allied Health will be the last contract position to be hired from Strong Workforce.
- Amanda Horner requested clarification on the roles of the WBL team (see below) Note: the WBL task breakdown will be communicated to the campus and posted on WBL website.
- Work-Based Learning
 - Service Learning: Katlin Choi, WBL Coordinator presented the different activities/events.
 - Faculty are talking to partners to help integrate to classroom. Will be collecting more data (Example with ENGL 101). There will be another event on the 22nd with community partners (Salvation Army).
 - ELAC 45 in collaboration with Donna Duchow (CTE emphasis) will like to partner with CTE / supporting other classes. 'Learn English and learn to apply skills they are learning.'
 - Art Gallery in collaboration with Alessandra Moctezuma, Fleet Science Center tour exhibit, student fieldtrip. Will have ready an internship
 - Presented a Service Learning video: Maria Pandolfo (Eng 101) Mesa student fall 2018.
 - Internships: Pavel Consuegra, Internship Coordinator spoke about Community partners (Not-For profit) for internships.
 - STEM Core, Promise Student (refugee student national conference, full time internship)
 - Veteran's internship Ten (10) veterans to place. Working very close with partners (with agency)
 - Reaching out to more student (8) different workshops, soft skills summer internships
 - Also meets with students on a one on one basis
 - Announce the Career Week (Internship Fair) is coming soon.
 - Aileen Crakes commended for working with our student Veterans.
 - Work Experience: Shawn Fawcett, WBL Coordinator spoke about the student world of work.
 - 21st Century skills DCP (Workshops). Students enjoy the exposure to companies.
 - Work Experience has (3) Academic components to Internships: 1) General Work Experience 272; 2) Occupational Work Experience 270; and 3) Discipline Specific Work Experience 270 (ex. NUTR 270)
 - Work Experience collaborates with City and Miramar for improvements and Mesa is piloting online forms..

- WE is also implement the 21st Century Skills evaluation in coordination with the site Supervisor.
- SP19 there are 100 students enrolled in WE: 66% unpaid, 33% paid (125 hours per semester. Working with 74 companies.
- Last semester there was a survey of how many students were already working. Several were already working, why not get college credit?
- Job Development/Placement: Melanie Davidson, Job Development Coordinator just started with this assignment here at Mesa.
 - Melanie is working on creating two surveys: Employer Engagement with the College and Faculty Engagement with Employers
 - Acknowledge she working with the Career Center and Faculty closely
- Amanda asked regarding providing extra credit to her students if attending this type of events. WBL learning explained that have an activity in which students had a "passport" that was stamped by the tables the students visited; they are thinking of having it again this time.

• Budget (Monica Romero)

- o Three year graph of Strong Workforce campus allocations was presented.
- o SW is a 30 month budget cycle and recently closed (12/31/19) the first round of funds.
- Along with the annual budget which included activity such as: Salaries and Benefits, Program Review/BARC processes, Construction (estimates), new program supplies, operating expenses, a salary summary of all the assignment in support of the different programs; an operating summary of the marketing.
- Conference & Travel: Strong Workforce has allocated funds to the The Conference & Travel committee (CAT) in support of CTE programs. \$40,000 for Faculty and Classified Professionals.
