Institutional Learning Outcomes and Revised ACCJC Accreditation Standards

ACCJC has issued a draft of revised accreditation standards for stakeholders to review. The revised standards include several additions based on national trends, as well as a simplified format. Among the additions is a standard related to graduate demonstration of competencies. This standard specifies the broad skill areas that degree program graduates should achieve. Below is a matrix linking ACCJC competencies with Mesa College's six institutional learning outcomes. As the table shows, there are five areas among the ACCJC competencies that Mesa's ILOs do not currently address. These areas will need to be addressed prior to the college's next comprehensive evaluation, which will take place in 2016.
