<ul> <li>b) Student Services Updates: Vice President of Student Services, Larry Maxey, gave the following updates:</li> <li>1) SDCCD has been selected to participate in a program called "Higher Up" which provides aid to students who have been justice-impacted (CalWorks and current former foster youth). This would provide a monthly stipend at the rate of the number of units they are currently taking. A full- time student would receive 40 hours a week at \$15.50 rate.</li> <li>2) Last Friday, Larry and Dr. O'Connor participated in the Non-Credit Alignment Lab (NCAL) Summit which is facilitated through the San Diego College of Continuing Education. At that Summit they discussed ways to continue to help the transition of our CE students into the colleges to create clear pathways. Topics included child development as well as nursing and how to expand those opportunities. From the Student Services prospective, these students are the key to our enrollment planning as well as the fact that they are already part of our district.</li> <li>3) The Black Excellence Symposium was held last Friday; Larry recognized Leticia Diaz, Robyn Bolden and all involved to make that a successful event.
