1) WELCOME / INTRODUCTIONS	P. Luster		
2) PRESIDENT'S REPORT President Pam Luster congratulated Dean Vicki Miller and the staff and faculty for the Jumpstart Program held last Saturday; several hundred attended. President Luster also congratulated Director Leticia Lopez and all the presenters on the successful HSI Conference.	P. Luster		SD4, SD6
a) Campus Updates/District Updates: President Luster reminded everyone of the email from Vice Chancellor Lynn Neault on Campus Solutions Implementation (March 18, 2019). The email has embedded links for the training schedule and training registration. A problem has been found that only certain browsers can open an electronic TAO and that issue is being resolved. The email also included milestones for March, April and May. Pam asked that all please forward the email to their constituent groups.			
b) President Luster there is now more definitive information on the funding for this year; the Period 1 report is out and it appears we have been funded at a lower rate than we anticipated, and therefore we are working together as a District to identify some expenses reductions in this year, and expense reductions for next year. Pam stated at Mesa College, we are reviewing positions that were not filled, and that we should be able to accomplish any reductions required from Mesa College through unfilled positions. President Luster added that if there is the same amount of reduction required next year (as determined from the student-centered funding formula), it is possible that Mesa College would have to carry reductions from this year into next year and continue to reduce more. Dr. Luster reassured all that Mesa College is very conservative in the way it budgets, but there will not a lot of extra money for some items and we will have to tighten our belts from a discretionary perspective. The Chancellor will send a message to the entire District which is expected this week that will share her plan across the District; all District entities are being treated equally – all are looking at their budgets.			

3) INSTITUTIONAL COMMITTEE REPORTS*

a) Safety/Facilities: Vice President of Administration, Lorenze Legaspi, stated that the Safety and Facilities Committees are both participatory governance. VPA Legaspi shared the purpose of the Facilities Planning Committee and the Safety Committee – including each committee's 2018-2019 membership, and 2018-2019 updates.

VPA Legaspi adding that the Facilities Committee is reviewing the process of "norming" what is a work order and what is a facilities request through the BARC process.

b) Integration Presentation – SSSP, Equity, Basic Skills: Presenters are Dean of Student Success and Equity, Larry Maxey; Dean of Student Development, Ailene Crakes, and Instructional Learning Assistance Coordinator, Mark Manasse who shared program highlights.

Dr. Manasse highlighted the work of the mentor program for tutoring, and highlighted the work of Joe Lunsford (senior tutor) and Megan Corieri (student and tutor).

Dean Maxey shared on equity by highlighting the work of Edeama Onwuchekwa in the LRC, who has done phenomenal work as an equity librarian providing student resources, mindful interaction, communicating access, and engaging students in the resource center.

Dean Maxey also shared that they have been working on is the definition – a framework for how we determine success in regards to our equity work. A definition was developed that is on the Student Success Equity website and created posters that will be posted in classrooms that visually highlight what equity looks like – a representation of equity vs. equality.

The presentation also included data from previous equity initiatives and plans; long and short term goals were set for completion rates, degree attainment, and transfer rate.

Dean Crakes stated as they reflected on their student success accomplishments and projects, it can be demonstrated by the amount of growth. Student Success went from having 14 full-time counselors to 24; and they have grown not only within the department but also expanding their services to reach out to more students. A video was shared that highlighted Joseph Lunsford, Megan

It was determined they would go to the Statewide Academic Senate and urge them to oppose this move and ask the Cal States to delay the move to make sure History professors are part of any decisions regarding American Institution and that the process is transparent. a) BARC: Vice President of Administrative Services, Lorenze Legaspi, shared the BARC request list on screen which is part of the Program Review cycle and how we have planning-based resource allocation, which is an accreditation standard, and best practices by basing what our needs are on what the College's mission and goals are and what everyone is doing in their individual programs. There were 208 requests for \$2.9 million; 100 requests made a 70% score. Once Program Review is completed and the BARC requests are put in along with the CHP and FHP lists; they go to the individual committees. Next step is that VPA Legaspi and President Luster will review the list and the funding sources available. VPI O'Connor shared that in Yolanda Catano attended the Leading from the Middle Academy held at Cal Poly in Pomona which also included Toni Parsons, Howard Eskew, Nancy Cortez, a counseling representative and Dean Leslie Shimazaki. The purpose of the academy was to determine how they			

would connect with the guided pathways initiative and they choose to focus on communication.		
Howard Eskew, co-chair of Mesa Pathways, thanked Bridget Herrin for the "Navigating Mesa" event which will be held again 4-5 p.m. tomorrow in LRC 435; they will also videotape the program and make it available on the webpage. Howard stated they are working on getting the Mesa Pathways webpage up to date and having more resources such as minutes, schedules, pictures.		
Howard stated a scale of adoption assessment was sent to the governance groups, the Mesa Pathway Committee and inquiry groups. The assessment is due April 30, 2019 and will be brought back to President's Cabinet prior to that due date.		
Howard shared that he and Toni Parsons are starting to actively meet on campus with COA, Chairs, Academic Senate, Classified Senate, Student Services leadership and CTE. They are also asking the inquiry groups to report out and develop plans, outcomes, and resources for the remainder of the semester and the next academic year and beyond.		
The Pathways Committee held a mini-retreat last Tuesday. They are sending two teams to "connecting to the dots" - data-informed integrative planning. One is scheduled for Thursday and the following Thursday; please send Toni Parsons an email if you are interested in attend.		
Howard shared there will be two cross-disciplinary discussion for faculty and counselors; the first will be held on Thursday, April, 2:30 – 3:45 p.m. in the LOFT on building pathways for students.		
Manuel Velez shared that this has been a year of inquiry and have received a lot of great information, including feedback from the Pathways retreat. His team is holding a group conversation toward concrete structures/ideas to form an end product.
