# 4) Institutional Reports

a) Budget Allocation and Recommendation Committee (BARC): Second Reading. VPA Legaspi shared the only change to this list from the first reading is that the Career Education funding of \$50,000 has been confirmed. The next step after approval is that VPA Legaspi will send out notifications to those funded.

Action Item: A motion was made to accept the BARC Resource List by: Isabel O'Connor; Second: Veronica Gerace. The motion was approved unanimously.

b) Classified Hiring Priority (CHP): Second Reading. There were no changes made to the CHP list from the first reading.

Action Item: A motion was made to accept the CHP List by: Isabel O'Connor; Second: Larry Maxey. The motion was approved unanimously.

c) Faculty Hiring Priority (FHP): First Reading. VPI Isabel O'Connor, and Academic Senate President, Andrew Hoffman, presented the first reading of the Faculty Hiring List. Dr. O'Connor shared that the FHP membership is one-half administrators, one-half faculty, that serve a two-year term. After the end of the term, they rotate the membership (if a school had a Dean representative for two-years, then it is rotated to a faculty member for the next two years.) The presentation included the timeline of the meetings and rubric (the committee uses the same rubric as CHP and BARC.) A discussion was held by the FHP Committee on some factors of the rubric to be more weighted than others. The list originally had 42 submissions, some were forwarded to the BARC or CHP list, and the list presented at this meeting has 38 requests (one application was incomplete.) The next step is the second reading at the next President's Cabinet meeting, and then the list is forwarded to the President.

d) Mesa Pathways – Mapper Program: Marisa Alioto, Co-chair of the Mesa Pathways Committee, presented Lorenze Legaspi, VPA

## 6) OPERATIONS

- a) Instructional Updates: Vice President of Instruction, Isabel, gave the following updates:
- 1) Dr. O'Connor attended the Academic Senate meeting.
- 2) Instruction continues to work on summer and fall scheduling and are still working with the District Office to address fraudulent enrollment. The second 8-week session is fast approaching; the Office of Communications, Counseling, and others are working to rebuild the enrollment in the sections that were heavily impacted. The FTES went down by 45 after some of the fraudulent enrollments were cleared from the system. They recovered 19 of those FTES as of today.
- 4) On March 13, the Allied Health department opened their doors to Counseling. It was the best of both worlds; the merging of instruction as well as colleagues in counseling learning about the programs and collaborating together.
- b) Student Services Updates: Vice President of Student Services, Larry Maxey, gave the following updates:
- 1) VPSS Maxey acknowledged the work taking place to develop the Family Resource Center due to open April 1, 2024.
- 2) Last week, Larry Maxey and Ailene Crakes attended the CSSO Conference in San Francisco with colleagues in attendance from across the State who were engaging in activities to support students.
- 3) VPSS and 37 students took a charter bus to attend the A2MEND Conference held March 7-8, 2024. It was affirming for our black African American students to be in a space where energy and black excellence was being demonstrated. It was encouraging for them and VPSS Maxey to see them engaging in those spaces.
- 4) This past week they have been meeting on Affinity spaces and final determinations were discussed for those who have been selected for spaces. The primary focus as part of our Mesa2030 is looking forward to the
