The presentation included the purpose of CEL, updates including the planning of Classicon (Classified Professionals Conference), annual flex survey, current activities, new programming and the implementation of Cornerstone Professional Learning LMS in Summer 2020. a) Academic Senate: Academic Senate President, Kim Perigo, shared the following: 1) Kim thanked Manuel Velez who assisted her while she was in Berlin and then at the National competition. 2) Senate created a resolution in support of AB 1150 – the bill that states anyone running for the SDCCD Board of Trustees must collect 100 signatures. Senate also created a letter of support; Jim Mahler took both forward. 3) Senate passed a resolution on some constitutional changes – they are trying to expand the number of faculty that can run for certain offices – some should be tenured (President, VP, Chair of Chairs), however they feel a Senator-at-Large and the Secretary and Treasurer positions could be tenure-track or tenured. Also, in the same resolution there is a provision that if a position is uncontested that the Senate Exec can appoint someone and it can be any faculty member on campus (adjunct, tenured, non-tenured). 4) Elections were held with the following results: Howard Eskew – Vice President Leslie Seiger – Senator-at-Large Secretary – Vacant (Senate Exec will appoint this position) Oscar de la Torres – Academic Affairs Terry Kohlenberg – re-elected Chair of Chairs 5) Members of the Senate attended Plenary – Kim Perigo, Manuel Velez, Terry Kohlenberg, Toni Parsons, and Howard Eskew and will provide a more detailed report. The ASCCC website should have the full packet of resolutions that were affirmed. 6) A resolution on the homeless student parking bill – there was some hesitancy in that the bill is not just permissive, it is mandating that campuses provide this parking and they believe there might be a District solution. The Senate did pass support for the homeless student parking bill.	K. Perigo		SD2

7) Tomorrow is a meeting with the Budget committee – Kim stated she placed an item on the agenda to discuss deadlines on closing the books; co-curricular was asked to stop purchasing and they have not completed their traveling for this semester. 8) They are creating their board report and will talk about their concerns with aligning their goals to Vision for Success and how that is stripping away local control. They will talk to the Board about them being more active about not allowing the State to decide what the local goals should be and how to serve the people in this area. 9) The SDCCD Academic Senate presidents reach out to all the other colleges that had votes of no confidence (Chancellor Oakley) and got a temperature of where the group is or do they want to move forward. There is discussion about looking at a way to break down the State into smaller areas (currently in four areas in the Statewide Senate) and trying to make those active bubbles. 10) Kim asked all to be kind to the Senate – they are getting many requests to attend their meeting to get approval for projects and this is getting difficult to find time – they only have two meetings left and would need a first and second reading. As we move forward into the next academic year please remember that the Senate meetings cannot handle the amount of requests they are receiving late in the semester.

a) Mesa Pathways: Vice President of Instruction, Isabel O'Connor, shared the following: 1) They are circulating the self-assessment through April 30. It will make the rounds to Classified Senate, Faculty Senate and other bodies. They will collect the information and circulate again and create a draft with all the input. The final draft is due in late September. 2) Thank you to Manuel Velez for his presentation at the Pcab Retreat on Guided Pathways. He led an exercise on looking ahead on Mesa Pathways and the idea was to encourage the member to imagine Mesa Pathways 8 years from now and the concrete tools that would define Mesa Pathways. VPI O'Connor stated they produced a lot of data out of that retreat and next steps is the leadership will review the input and will create a plan for next year – including some potential summer activities. 3) VPI O'Connor shared there is a lot of mapping activity across campus; Susan Topham shared with her some of the maps her school is producing, including one from Biology that maps to the different	I. b) Enrollment Report: VPI O'Connor shared that the good news is that Mesa College is projected to not only meet its enrollment target for this year but will exceed it by approximately 1.5%. She has been talking to some Deans and department Chairs about possibly adding some classes to the summer schedule. For 19-20, in terms of targets and how it compares to this this year – the latest draft of the target for 19-20 is 13,675 FTES which is about 200 FTES more than what we produced this year.	I. They are looking at adding some high school enrollment classes, particularly in CTE. Thank you to Danene Brown who is going to Patrick Henry High School because they are interested in Computer Science offerings. Another area of exploration is adding Personal Growth classes – a pilot – in some high schools.
