a) District and Campus Updates: President Hands shared that many just came from the Holocaust remembrance event which is why President's Cabinet was moved to room LRC 435. She thanked the District Office for coordinating this event.	Ashanti T. Hands, President
Dr. Hands stated many had asked questions about Greg Smith serving as the acting Chancellor. If there is an immediate need or concern, someone can be appointed to serve in that capacity. If the acting role is going to extend beyond 30 days, then the District has to take official action. She anticipates receiving some word at the April 27, 2023 Board of Trustees meeting on the next steps on the Chancellor position.	
The State of California budget: we are very likely moving back into uncertain times with our budget. Because of the extension given to file state taxes, we will know more once we receive the May revise report; but we are not getting a lot of good information. A budget update will be given at the DGC meeting as well as at the April 27 BOT meeting.	
The 2021-22 Annual Report is completed and copies were distributed. This document is also on the website.	
Dr. Hands shared that this month the RP Group recognized Hai Hoang for his leadership in the statewide evaluation of the Bachelor's Degree Program since 2019 leading to AB 927. Hai also collaborated with UCLA to publish a research brief titled "Benefits and Opportunities: California's Community College Baccalaureate Programs" through Wheelhouse at UC Davis, which provided compelling evidence that the Bachelor's Degree Program has increased access and success for special populations, helped them secure good-paying jobs, and is benefiting the California economy.

 a) Instructional Updates: Dean Leslie Shimazaki shared the following instructional updates: 1) The schedule went live yesterday for summer and fall. The summer priority registration will begin on April 24 and open registration will open on April 28; fall registration on May 1, 2023. 2) Instruction is focusing on what appears to be a lot of fraudulent enrollment for some second 8-week term classes. The numbers came back showing 162 fraudulent enrollments, but it could be more significant. 3) They are partnering with a non-profit organization called Treobytes that has the mission of changing socioeconomic trajectory for students by providing vocational STEM education; it is open to all students. The first workshop will be held on the April 20, 2023 with a fundamental workshop on circuit boards that teaches you how to move things robotically. 4) They are starting promotional efforts for the evening Olympian program.
