1) CALL TO ORDER: Ashanti Hands, President

2) PRESIDENT'S REPORT

- a) District and Campus Updates: President Ashanti Hands shared the following updates:
- 1) An email was sent to different groups about the Chancellor's search. If you are interested in having your name included, please speak with your representative group. May 19, 2023 is the deadline to submit those names. The goal is to have the Chancellor in place in January 2024.
- 2) There is a campus climate pilot survey being held for students to get some good benchmark data.
- 3) Free menstrual products to students: the supplies throughout the District have been disappearing very quickly and we are not able to keep the dispensers full. They will hold some additional conversations with students and basic needs staff to discuss how to keep these stocked.
- 4) Food trucks: Food truck service was going to end this week but we have been able to keep them extended through finals for the students. There will be discussions on what this looks like moving forward.
- 5) Conversations will be held on ways we can partner with District for fundraising and supporting programs.
- 6) Ashanti stated she had sent information about evaluations (for everyone but faculty). After continuing to listen to the administrative and executive team, she stated we are going to pull back on what was intended to be an informal opportunity for us to have regular conversations. This process was mixed with formal processes and documents and she can see how this was confusing. She will ask the supervisors and managers to hold annual "check-ins" with employees and she provided a list of possible questions on ways those meetings can be structured. She stated that there are employees who have never been evaluated; this is not good because there is no way to provided feedback to see what support is needed as well as to give staff kudos for their work. The annual "check-ins" are something that will regularly allow us to do that.
- 7) Dr. Hands mentioned there have been some discussions on how information is communicated because she is finding there are conversations that are being considered final processes when they actually have not been finalized. She is determining how we can build in processes to our communications including who is given access to the information.
- 8) Flag Pole: Next to our existing flag pole an additional pole has been installed. The District is drafting a policy and we hope to be able to raise flags that honor certain months, certain groups, etc. such as the month of June is Pride Month and also includes Juneteenth. There will

be guidelines on which flags will be flown, for how long, and information on the approval process. The draft policy has not yet been approved; as it states now, the Board will approve which flags will be flown but they will not do that until January. However, a Board resolution was passed in honor of Pride Month stating that a flag will be flown for Pride. We are also looking at something for Juneteenth. 9) Board Reports: Each College submits a document for the June SDCCD Board Retreat which shares highlights of things occurring on campus. They are requesting donations and purchasing tickets for their Classified Senate Committee Fundraising – tickets will be for the opportunity drawings for gift cards and baskets. c) Academic Senate: AS President, John Crocitti, shared John Crocitti, President the following updates: 1) The last AS meeting was held a week ago with guest Laurie Coskey, Vice Chancellor of Development and Entrepreneurship. 2) John shared the Legislative Analyst Office is projecting \$25-\$30 billion deficit in the State Budget for next year. President Hands stated the May revise is out and Acting Chancellor Smith will send an update – a lot of the projected numbers will not be finalized until later. Dr. Hands shared there are a lot of things to think about: including that we are set in 2024-25 to come off of "hold harmless" for the funding formula. We are currently being funded for \$22 million that we are not earning. All of the work that VPI O'Connor is doing with faculty is in preparation for this. There are discussions on the Student-Centered Funding Formula; an opportunity for our campus is if more of our students complete the FAFSA, we might be able to make up that deficit. We are talking about strategies and making plans so that we are not faced with something that was not anticipated. 3) John shared the results of the 2023-2024 Senate elections: **Executive Committee:**

- e) Mesa Pathways Workplan Presentation: The Mesa Pathways Committee Co-chair, Howard Eskew, presented the work plan which stated that the final allocation of funding has been received, the spending deadline is June 30, 2023, and that this work plan replaces the Scale of Adoption Assessment (SOAA). The goal is to have Mesa Pathways serve as the lens for San Diego Mesa College's equity work.

5) OPERATIONS

- a) Instructional Updates: Isabel O'Connor, Vice President of Instruction, gave the following updates:
- 1) The summer enrollment is going very strongly; there are a few classes such as athletics where they are in the process of being recruited and have not completed the registration process.
- 2) The targets for next year at about 12,000 FTES based on actuals + 4%.
- 3) They are working diligently and will be connecting with John Crocitti about the AB 1705 implementation plan. A meeting was held on campus with the AB 1705 group which Dean Carmichael coordinated to include instruction, student services, and institutional effectiveness. Once it is finalized, it will need the AS president's signature.
- 4) The work of AB 1111 continues and they are making progress through the task force.
- b) Student Services Updates: Larry Maxey, Vice President of Student Services, gave the following updates:
- 1) Student Services will be partnering with the Inside Track organization for an initiative called "California Reconnect" which will work to recapture students who have completed at least 30 units in our system.
- 2) Summer CRUISE dates are available and listed on the website.
- 3) We will be moving forward with the campus-wide test proctoring center to make sure it is ready to go for the fall semester.
- 4) EOPS Summer Readiness Program is coming back. There will be a 4-week session in July. Students are able to apply now for the program.
- 5) DSPS will have a summer camp, August 7-9, 2023. This is for new DSPS students to learn about Mesa College and the services we offer.
- 6) There will be a Peer 120 course this summer taught by Michael Temple offered to student athletes.
- 7) Day 2 of the Kapwa learning community annual Scholarship Summit will be held tomorrow.
- 8) They look forward to celebrating our students at

- 9) Larry expressed his thanks to the various affinity groups' celebrations this past month which have been wonderful.
- 10) Dean Ailene Crakes will be coordinating a grant related to AANAPISI called AANHPI SAP Asian American Native Hawaiian Pacific Islander Student Achievement Program (AANHPI SAP).
- c) Administrative Services Updates: Lorenze Legaspi, Vice President of Administrative Services, gave the following updates:
- 1) Budget: Some things are out of our control with the capital gains tax, but even though we have used our HEERF funds to support our students, we still have COVID-19 Block grant funds still available as well as enrollment and retention funds. They will be sending out the request forms which are very similar to the HEERF request forms to help get us through the next year.
- 2) Next year we are rolling out an affinity space request process; drafts have been sent out for review and the process will be available in the fall.
- d) Mesa2030 Facilities Planning Task Force: VPA Legaspi shared the following updates:
- 1) Lorenze thanked Blythe Barton and all of those on the task force who gathered more input for Mesa2030 via Convocation (presentation and breakout session). They prioritized projects based on students' experiences and listed the projects they deemed necessary to have on campus. No prioritization had previously been given to them; now that they are within the timeline for the capital outlay and bond planning project they have now prioritized the list.
- 2) They have held great conversations with past experiences of those that have been on campus and what we want our experience to look like moving forward.
- 3) They have been learning about the bond process: what is large-scale capital outlay planning: who does what... when... where... this is the work they will continue in the next semester.
- 4) Most importantly they want to review communication expectations on who makes the decisions, such as when and who gets to be in the room. This is something they will be working on with the group and documenting the decision-making and how they expect the campus to be informed (such as why did something happen that was out of the plan, etc.)
- e) Program Review / Accreditation: Hai Hoang, Acting Dean for Institutional Effectiveness, gave the following updates:
- 1) Program Review: Hai shared that the deadline for Program Reviews is May 31, 2023. Instructions on how to submit were sent this morning to the DL and noted

2) Accreditation: Hai Hoang and Lisa Shapiro will present to the board sub-committee on May 10, 2023. Currently the IE office is formatting and reviewing the final draft.
