1) CALL TO ORDER: Ashanti Hands, President

2) PRESIDENT'S REPORT

a) District and Campus Updates: President Hands stated that SB 447 passed and we will now no longer be required to request Chancellor's approval to travel to banned states. Instead, they are building a caveat where they are going to make sure the message they want to convey about LGBTQ populations are expressed to those states – to promote more awareness and hope that they do things differently. This is effective immediately.

We have partnered with General Hope / FamilyU for the purpose of making sure we are serving our parenting students well. At last look at the data it showed that just above 22% of our students are student parents. One of our upcoming presentations will tell more about the program and we will also highlight our partnership at our presentation to the Board of Trustees on November 9, 2023. Mesa College received a Seal from the FamilyU Seal program; schools had to apply for that Seal and show they met the standards by demonstrating that they are actively creating those conditions for successful outcomes for these students.

Twenty-five positions were created a few years ago from State funds for faculty positions; these positions were split among the colleges. The District, as a result of those 25 being hired, stated from further analysis on those hires that SDCCD was able to save costs with hiring adjuncts. They want to feed back into that same program and will now have 14 new faculty positions throughout the District. CE and Miramar got 4 positions each; Mesa and City will get 3 positions each. Two of the Mesa College positions are for counseling faculty. Therefore, from the 13 positions from the Faculty Hiring Priority List 13 there is + 1 position. There will be a discussion on what that looks like and the impact.

6) OPERATIONS

- a) Instructional Updates: Isabel O'Connor, Vice President of Instruction, shared the following updates:
- 1) Isabel shared that she was honorary captain for the Mesa College football team. She addressed the team on Friday and on Saturday she flipped the coin; it was a great experience for her to get to know these students.
- 2) Week five of enrollment, Mesa College is doing much better. For the first time in many years we have reached efficiency 15%. That is the magic number where things break even. We are having an incredible second 8-week group of classes that are packed. We are up on all the KPIs and they are indicating up in the right way. We are 14% up from a year ago in terms of FTES generation. She predicts we will be at least 6-6.8% this year compared to the last academic year. Productivity we are 11% up; progress to target is 23% up. This is the result of a lot of work from the Deans and department chairs.
- 3) Analysis of data is being held at Deans' Council; she thanked Donna Budzynski who is very good with numbers and she is helping shape those conversations. This morning at Deans' Council Cynthia Rico attended and held a conversation on clarifying some items, how classes were not cancelled until after the drop for non-payment (date of August 8). They also discussed the demand for students that go to counseling and how to continue collaboration with counseling.
- b) Student Services Updates: Vicki Miller, Dean of Student Affairs, presented on behalf of VPSS Larry Maxey and shared the following:
- 1) Cross-cultural solidarity mixer is being held with KAPWA, Emoji and Puente on Wednesday, September 20.
- 2) Transfer Career and Evaluations has a Monster University Open House on September 26-27, from 10:00 a.m.- 3:00 p.m.

- 3) The AANAPISI external evaluator visit is occurring this week.
- 4) SS&E Rising Scholars Team will be supporting students with a clinic on September 19.
- 5) The Pride Center is hosting the academic year free HIV testing in collaboration with San Ysidro Health. Please forward this information to students.
- 6) Pride Scholars program welcomed 116 students.
- 7) Dreamer Resource Center and Borderless Scholars are holding free immigration consultations with attorneys for employees and students.
- 8) Club Rush is being held today, day 1 of 3 days. 35 Clubs participated on the Sunrise Plaza. They elevating their collaboration with the Inter-Club Council. Elections for I.C.C. will be held on Friday.
- 9) Spirit Week is October 16 21, 2023; there will be a decorating contest and other activities occurring, including the Pep Rally to recognize the Mesa College athletes; AS will be hosting a carnival on October 18.
- 10) September is Suicide Awareness Prevention every week Student Mental Health and Student Health have collaborated to host an event. Last week was a t-shirt distribution 300 shirts were distributed. This also includes zoom counseling for students.
- 11) COVID is on the rise; Suzanne Khambata shared that numbers are increasing and Student Health will be holding a workshop on how to protest yourself from the new strand of COVID. Flu shots are available at Student Health.
- 12) LiveChat online resource is a resource that is manned by Student Affairs interns and project assistants of the Mesa Journeys, and Outreach Ambassadors, not Al. Some classified professionals help during the evening hours, they have impacted 7,300 students who have asked questions and able to get a quick response. There is an Al responding that Chatbot has responded to 75,000 inquiries.
- 13) Scholarship: Last they offered students that participated in the writing workshops and applied for three scholarships received \$100. The data showed that of the 200 students that attended the workshop had a much higher rate of being awarded a scholarship. Of the total amount of scholarships awarded, 41% of the funds were awarded to students that attended the workshop.
- c) Administrative Services Updates and CA Budget Highlights: VPA Legaspi shared on the SDCCD Adopted Budget link, which is available on the SDCCD BoardDocs website, where he added some of the Mesa2030 Strategic Objectives to the items he is presenting to make sure we are highlighting our focus on Mesa2030 and the Roadmap. The Adopted Budget was presented to the board at last Thursday's meeting and VPA Legaspi shared some of the highlights, including the volatility of the California State budget and how our district, SDCCD, will have to respond. 2023-24 has a deficit of \$31,500,000,000. A special reserve was set up by the

current and previous governors for economic uncertainty which is money set aside from the State that goes to K-12 and community colleges. An 8.22% Cost of Living adjustment was received. The District is emerging from Hold Harmless; the emergency conditions allowance contends the State will fund colleges at whatever FTES they received in the fiscal year 18-19. This year moving forward we will be using our total FTES as part of a 3-year rolling average. VPA Legaspi noted that City College was approved for a housing grant where they received \$75 million from the State for affordable student housing. It is 808 beds they will be building downtown. - 1) October 12, 2023, from 1:00 2:00 p.m., is the Accreditation Team Open Forum to the Mesa College campus. Two meetings have been scheduled with the ACCJC Visiting Team: a team meeting with our executive leadership on Monday, September 25, 2023; and then the Open Forum held via Zoom for them to be able to share information with the entire campus.

For Program Review, information has been shared on how to complete and do it within the new system that we have. As emails are shared, they will provide training dates and opportunity to engage with the process.

e) Mesa Pathways: Marisa Alioto, Co-Chair of the Mesa Pathways Committee, shared an update on Mesa Success Coaches. They held a check-in with Ian Duckles today who shared that they have 46 coaches and 225 students being served. The coaches are meeting regularly and students who have requested to be texted are found to be more engaged.
