PRESIDENT'S UPDATES

1) District Updates: President Pam Luster shared that she will be attending a training session in Los Angeles tomorrow to serve as the accreditation chair for a team visiting East LA College in spring. The new accreditation standards will be distributed at this training.

COLLEGE-WIDE PLANNING

1) Institutional Effectiveness – Integrated Planning Calendar – Second Read (Hinkes): Madeleine Hinkes, Dean of Institutional Effectiveness, presented the Integrated Planning calendar for its second reading. The calendar has been reviewed by the PIE Committee and President's Cabinet and is a guide to the level of coordination of the work our college needs to complete in 2015-2016.

Action Item: Motion to accept the Integrated Planning Calendar and forward to President Luster for final approval. Motion: Tim McGrath; Second: Larry Maxey. After discussion, the document was approved unanimously.

2) Institutional Effectiveness - San Diego Mesa College Institution-Set Standards (Hays): Bri Hays, Campus-based researcher, presented the Institution-Set Standards that were initially developed by the PIE Committee in October 2015. The standards have been reviewed by other constituent groups represented by the committee before being brought to President's Cabinet today. These eight standards of performance allow for comparison of actual performance to evaluate student achievement. The next step to this process is to finalize the Institution-Set Standards and submit the new standards in the Annual Report due in March.

Action Item: Motion to accept the Institution-Set Standards and forward to President Luster for final approval. Motion: Tim McGrath; Second: Angela Liewen. After discussion, the document was approved unanimously.

3) Reflection Space (Judy Sundayo): Diversity Committee Chair Judy Sundayo presented for the second discussion to President's Cabinet on the proposal for a reflection space. Judy shared that they have

changed the name to "quiet room" after receiving feedback and researching these spaces in other colleges/universities. The next step is to receive endorsement from President's Cabinet to explore possible spaces on the San Diego Mesa College campus. It was also suggested to reach out to the student body for their suggestions on use and name for this space. A recommendation was made and voted unanimously by members of President's Cabinet to request the Facilities Committee in January to explore available space and resources and report back to President Luster and President's Cabinet with their recommendations.
