COLLEGE-WIDE PLANNING

1) Program Review (Hinkes): Dean of Institutional Effectiveness, Madeleine Hinkes, reminded everyone that the deadline to submit Program Reviews to liaisons/managers is December 21. She stated you must submit separately to both your liaison and your manager. President Luster added that a survey on the Communication Outcomes Assessment for the President's Office was sent this week and asked that all participate. President Luster also shared that notes from the President's Cabinet retreat will be compiled and then forwarded to the accreditation tri-chairs, Danene Brown, Chris Sullivan and Trina Larson for review. This document will be submitted to a spring 2016 President's Cabinet meeting.

INSTRUCTION | VPI, Tim McGrath

1) Spring Enrollment: Vice President of Instruction, Tim McGrath, reported that there is no official report of Spring 2016 enrollment as of today. Tim shared that Biology, Chemistry and Physical Sciences classes are full or near full. Out of 2700 classes, 900 are now closed. Tim also shared that we will hold an intercession semester next year and that he is in discussion with the Deans on a PACE course – accelerated college education – for Business, to be held Friday and Saturdays as well as online. President Luster shared that the District Office had two enrollment management studies which identified courses which are often on wait lists and basic availability of courses.

STUDENT SERVICES | Acting VPSS, Ashanti Hands

- 1) Saturday on the Mesa: Jumpstart Your Success", Saturday, February 27, 2016, 9 a.m. 2 p.m. Dean of Student Affairs, Ashanti Hands, shared that this event is to target the community and perspective students to highlight our campus with interactive activities. This is a recruiting event and Deans, Supervisors and other leaders were sent an email asking for services/events to be offered from each area. Deadline is February 5 to submit your activity/event to Ashanti. The event will end with a lunch and will also include an Information Fair.
- 2) Title IX Training (Hands): Ashanti shared that there will be upcoming opportunities for training on the new laws pertaining to Title IX. These trainings will be one-hour sessions online; flex numbers will be assigned for these trainings all will receive an email notification on date/time.
- 3) Online Submissions: Faculty (Removal from Class) and Incident Report Forms (Hands): Ashanti shared that the faculty removal and incident report forms will now be online submissions (pilot phase). When these forms are completed, a submit will forward the document to Ashanti. It was requested that these forms be sent to Classified Senate representatives for review during the pilot phase. The online submissions for these forms will go live in the spring and all will be notified by email.
