c) Facilities Committee Report – A report was given from the transportation workgroup and cleaning/communication workgroup of the Facilities Committee. The transportation plan will be presented to a future President's Cabinet meeting. The cleaning workgroup discussed the issues of the ratio of facility personnel to Mesa staff. Dave Warczakowski, Facility Supervisor, stated although four new custodians are being hired, it is still a challenge to serve the college. To assist, the workgroup made the recommendation for Mesa staff to set their trash cans outside of their office doors or cubicles into the hallway to make the process of collecting the trash easier. The workgroup also suggested re-establishing the 3 <sup>rd</sup> shift for facilities, hiring more supervisors, and for Mesa staff to re-evaluate when planning events to relieve some of the pressure, especially during weeks with multiple events. Next steps include a Campus Pride campaign and a proposal for a small group communication class project. It was also shared that a Facilities Operational Plan will be developed for 2016-17 to include equipment maintenance. After the presentation, the members of President's Cabinet agreed with the recommendation from the Facilities Committee and will forward that recommendation for President Luster to consider, effective immediately, that Mesa staff be asked to place their trash and recycle cans outside their work areas into the hallway to assist the facility staff.
