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| b) Enrollment Update: Vice President of Instruction, Tim McGrath, gave the following enrollment update which included a slide on the Fall 2015 vs. Fall 2016 Headcount Analysis: 1. SD Mesa College is offering 43 more sections this semester compared to Fall 2015. (46 more Census week classes, 90 less census day classes and 48 more Distant Education (DE) classes.) 2. SD Mesa College is up 78.9 FTES from last year. (Down 141.5 FTES in census classes but up 152 FTES in DE classes and 49.3 in Work Experience and Independent Study.) 3. Headcount is up 1,098 students from last year and enrollment is statistically at 5% from where we were last year. 22,294 = Fall 2015 23,392 = Fall 2016 Note: On-campus enrollment = Up 222 students 17,956 = Fall 2015 18,178 = Fall 2016 DE = Up 876 students (Highest single growth area in district at 20%) 4,338 = Fall 2015 5,214 = Fall 2016 4. Mesa Percent of DE vs. On Campus – Fall 2016 is 18% higher DE than Fall 2015. | T.
